考察美國加州州立大學國際人才培訓課程報告

壹、 參訪動機

在全球化、國際化趨勢下,本部參加國際會議或舉辦國際會議等涉 外事務越來越繁重。為有計畫地培育本部暨所屬機關具發展潛力之 中階優秀人才,成為國際稅務人才,與國際接軌交流,李政務次長 瑞倉於 94 年 10 月間邀集相關機關首長開會研商「財稅菁英人才培 訓計畫」裁示先由本所就地辦理財稅菁英人才之培訓,於訓練將結 束時,於本計畫內規畫需要派員至國外學習。

本年度辦理的涉外人才培訓班學員,計有來自賦稅署、國庫署、關政司、稅制會、財稅資料中心、各地區國稅局、關稅局等學員 33 人參加訓練,訓練期間自 96 年 3 月 5 日至 5 月 25 日,為期 12 週,課程除加強學員英語聽、說、讀、寫能力之提升,並精心規劃,比照專業外交人員培訓,網羅國內台灣大學、政治大學、台北大學等知名專家學者,例如國際會議談判專家劉必榮博士、陳明通博士、陳多豪博士、詹滿容博士,並商請交部經貿司卓司長士昭、禮賓司朱司長玉鳳、經濟部國貿局黃局長志鵬等至所授課演講,甚獲受訓學員好評。

為規劃往後年度下一階段訓練課程,並設計課程意見調查表供參訓學員填列(附件1),問卷彙整結果如後附(附件2)。

依問卷結果(附件 2)顯示,學員對於師資及授課內容滿意度高達八成以上,並表達亟欲至國外學習交流之意願。為此,本所擬建立與國外知名學府長期合作之關係,以落實國際人才之培訓及國際觀之養成。

經多方接洽美國南美以美大學、美國加州州立大學、新加坡南洋科技大學及新加坡管理大學等學府商談合作辦班事宜。其中,美國南美以美大學為本所辦理國際租稅班(International Taxation Academy)長期合作對象,惟考量該大學近來與本所洽談班務事宜,姿態甚高,擬改與其他知名學府合作,最後,就師資及經費考量,似以美國加州州立大學規畫較為合適,惟仍需進一步磋商合作機制。

美國加州州立大學負責本案的 Dr. Hsing Fang 教授建議本部派員赴該

校洽談合作事宜,拜訪該校教授、觀摩該校設備並研商訓練內容。

本案遂於本(96)年 5 月 26 日奉 部長核可出國考察,遂由本人代表財 訓所於美國加州州立大學暑假期間赴該校訪問。

貳、 參訪經過

美國加州州立大學成立於 1947 年,計有 23 個校區,約有 40 餘萬名學生,以及 4 萬 6 千名教職員,為美國首屈一指的學府之一。為與美國加州州立大學合作辦理國際人才培訓事宜,本次拜訪該校洛杉磯校區(Los Angeles)、聖伯納迪諾校區(San Bernardino)、及長堤校區(Long Beach) 等三個校區,並參訪美國加州棕櫚泉沙漠學院 (College of the Desert, Palm Desert)。

(一) 美國加州州立大學洛杉磯校區

(California State University Los Angeles)

至洛杉磯校區,拜訪教授計有商學院副院長 Cheryl A. Cruz、財金系系主任 Dr. Cindy Fang、經濟系系主任 Dr. Edward Wei-Te Hsieh,協商派遣教授於本(96)年7月份至國際租稅班授課事宜。

加州州立大學洛杉磯校區建於 1947 年,提供超過 50 種專業高等學術及專業領域教育之綜合大學。該校區有六個學院,將近 50 個系所,並以吸引來自全美國及世界各國優秀學生著稱的教學中心。 21,000 個學生中有超過四分之一學生主修學士後研究,並繼續攻讀碩士及博士學位,包括教學、服務、專業證書、證明以及其他專業發展的課程。

加州州立大學洛杉磯校區坐落於洛杉磯西區,鄰近阿拉巴馬州西聖蓋峽谷市以及加州蒙特婁公園市,佔地將近 200 英畝,因地居山頂故校區視野極佳。校區有寬敞的停車場以及便利的公共運輸系統可達鄰近社區,包括公車、地下鐵以及火車。洛杉磯市中心僅距校園 5 英里,有歷史及文化景點可參觀,校園附近並有工業區、商業中心以及大型購物商場,受歡迎的山區及沙漠景點可在 2 小時內車距到達,1 小時內可達海岸。

該校區宿舍配備完善,提供單人房、雙人房供選擇,單位內有獨立 浴廁、廚房、寢室。宿舍區並提供衛星電視、電腦室、洗衣室、健 身房,宿舍裡並可免費無線上網,提供學生乾淨、舒適的住宿環 境。

(二) 美國加州州立大學聖伯納迪諾校區

(California State University San Bernardino)

拜訪聖伯納迪諾校區,和企業及公共管理學院院長 Dr. Karen Dill Bowerman、副院長 Dr.Frank Lin、國際事務學院副院長 Dr. Otto H. Chang、財務會計系系主任 Dr. Ghulam Sarwar 等教授商洽本部派員至該校區受訓等相關事宜。

聖伯納迪諾校區建立於 1965 年,對於提昇南加州地區高等教育以及提升社會、文化經濟進步功不可沒。每年約有 16,000 個新生入學,到 2010 年約計可招收超過 20,000 名學生。

聖伯納迪諾校區位於南加州正中心,屆於洛杉磯及棕櫚沙漠之間。 該校區提供超過 70 種學位及證書之研讀課程,供學生廣泛選擇,學 校教學設備先進齊全,為美國加州大學 23 個校園中最多元化的校園 之一,學生來自全美國及世界各地。

聖伯納迪諾校區宿舍區分有 University Village 以及 Serrano Village 以及 Arrowhead Village 三區,其中 University Village 為三樓層的設計,計有 132 間設備齊全的獨立個人房間,坐落大學對街,非常便利,設置有健身房、電腦室、游泳池、洗衣室等。 Serrano Village 宿舍為集合式住宅,提供不同生活需求之學員多樣化選擇。

聖伯納迪諾校區依據本部涉外人才課程需要,積極規劃為期一週的課程、師資(附件三),並估算所需經費(附件四)。

依據聖伯納迪諾校區提出之訓練計畫,針對本部亟需培養之涉外事務人才訓練,課程內容包括談判理論與實務介紹、談判溝通技巧、成功案例介紹、國際會議模擬演練及應注意事項等等一系列完整介紹。

師資部份則規劃延聘提供美國國防部公認商業合約談判專家 Dr. Cathy Levitt、Ansoff 國際策略管理機構院長 Dr. Peter Antonio、美國金門大學前副校長 Dr. Thomas Oneil 等三位講座授課。

至經費部分,聖伯納迪諾校區初步以 15 名學員估算訓練經費,1 週課程包括教師鐘點費、教材費、學校場地設備租借費、住宿費、餐

費、交通費等等合計約為美金 17,085 元,換算新台幣約 56 萬餘元,平均每名學員學費約需新台幣 3 萬 7 千餘元。



拜訪聖伯納迪諾校區企業及公共管理學院院長 Dr. Karen Dill Bowerman。

Dr. Karen Dill Bowerman 為目前美國國內有關犯罪會計學的專家,其專長為如何從會計報表及財務資料等,追蹤交易紀錄,分析犯罪以及資金流向等,可列為未來國內涉外人才培訓班及國際租稅班授課範圍。

(三)加州州立大學長堤校區(California State University Long Beach)

長堤校區則與企業經濟學院會計系教授 Dr. Edward L. Monsour 交換有關租稅法課程訓練事宜。

Dr. Edward L. Monsour 任教美國加州州立大學長堤校區及舊金山大學, 其專長如下:

- 1、為公司及合夥企業之稅務問題: 包括美國聯邦政府及加州對於公司及合夥企業所得稅的法令、 規定、行政命令以及法庭判決,以及公司及合夥企業程序問 題、稅務管理、稅務規劃及租稅逃避等問題,Dr. Edward L. Monsour 在這方面做了相當多獨立研究。
- 2、 稅務理論及企業運用: 在美國聯邦稅法的稅務觀念及司法原理,以及企業組織、資本 架構、企業政策及營運之租稅效果。
- 3、 租稅研究及實務: 研究複雜稅務問題方法學、租稅規劃以及稅務領域上會計師的 活動範圍、責任及道德。
- 4、公司及股東之稅務問題:包括公司設立、股權贖回及清償等公司稅的法令規定及實例研究;股票股利及特別股、個人持股公司、累積盈餘稅等。



(四)美國加州棕櫚泉沙漠學院 (College of the Desert, Palm Desert)

拜訪加州棕櫚泉沙漠學院(COD),與國際教育學院院長 Ms. Christina M. Delgado 及副院長 Cynthia Flores 洽談人才培訓事宜。

沙漠學院位於加利福尼亞州棕櫚沙漠,在世界聞名的棕櫚泉度假村旁邊。依偎在聖哈心朵山角下(San Jacinto Mountains),學生在此除可追求教育目標,並可享受茂盛的風景和令人驚嘆的山脈全景。該校南加州校區只須很短的行駛時間便能到達許多著名旅遊景點,包括洛杉磯、聖地牙哥、主題樂園、山脈和海灘。沙漠綠洲中有豐富的室外活動,包括網球錦標賽和高爾夫球場、美麗的健行目的地、購物、以及在約書亞樹國家公園(Joshua Tree National Park)和荒郊野外(Idyllwild)露營。

沙漠學院 建立於 1958 年,可授予副學士學位和職業證書。COD 也為學生提供職業和技術課程,計有 80 多個學位和獲證課程。主要任務是為一萬多名註冊學生提供全面的、以學生為中心的社區學院教育。所有教職員均擁有碩士學位,並且多數擁有博士學位。教職員致力於教學,並在課堂中使用各種各樣的教學方法,使學生有機會從卓越的教職員學到知識。

加州棕櫚泉沙漠學院是兩年制社區學院,提供 4 年制大學學位前兩年的學習,同時為學生成功地轉學到遍及美國的許多公立和私立大學作準備。沙漠學院已獲得西部學校及學院協會(Western Association of Schools and Colleges)的充分認可。該校留學生轉學到名校比例非常高,如加州大學(UC)柏克來分校、加州大學洛杉磯分校(UCLA)、加州大學爾灣分校(UC Irvine)、加州大學聖塔克魯茲分校(UC Santa Cruz)、加州大學河濱分校(UC Riverside)、聖地牙哥州立大學(San Diego State University)、舊金山州立大學(Su Francisco State University)、加州州立大學(CSU)富爾頓分校、CSU 長堤校區(CSU Long Beach),以及其他名校。

該學院國際教育課程為 200 多名國際留學生提供服務。目前學生來 自超過 35 個不同國家,課程相當多元化,包括本部亟需之國際人 才培訓課程,亦為該校之著名課程之一。

參、考察成果

- 一、 本次與美國加州州立大學洽談分別達成下列共識:
 - (一) 洛杉磯校區答應於本(96)年 7 月下旬派遣經濟系系主任 Dr. Edward Wei-Te Hsieh 至本所國際租稅班授課,講授所得稅及消費稅之最新國際改革趨勢(本課程原由美國南美以美大學派遣講座,但講座因故未能前來),授課大綱如附件八。
 - (二) 聖伯納迪諾校區願於暑假期間提供教學設備、師資、宿舍, 以供本部國際人才於該校區進行短期訓練(該校區離洛杉磯 國際機場約距 1.5 小時車程),並初步規劃提供美國國防部 公認商業合約談判專家 Dr. Cathy Levitt、Ansoff 國際策略管 理機構院長 Dr. Peter Antonio、美國金門大學前副校長 Dr. Thomas Oneil 等三位講座授課,以 15 名學員估算訓練經費約 為美金 17,085 元,換算新台幣約 56 萬餘元。
 - (三) 長堤校區 Edward L. Monsour 教授應允前來本所講授租稅相關法律課程,本所正安排規劃相關事宜。
- 二、加州棕櫚泉沙漠學院國際教育學院積極邀請本部涉外人才至該校 進行短期培訓(該校區距離杉磯國際機場約距為3小時車程)。
- 三、 未來國際人才培訓班如不選派學員出國,可邀請美國加州州立大 學講座至本所授課。
- 四、 綜上,本所初期擬先與美國加州州立大學洛杉磯等校區先行合作 辦理國際人才訓練。未來將進一步磋商合作辦理國際租稅班訓練 事宜。

肆、心得與建議

原則上美國加州州立大學同意派遣教授來台,並同意本所直接連繫該校 洛杉磯校區 Dr. Hsing Fang 及 Dr. Edward W.T. Hsieh 洽談合作辦班事 宜,並對我國派員至該校校區進行短期訓練表示歡迎。因此,對未來本 所有關國內訓練方向建議如下:

- 一、 財訓所往後開設涉外人才培訓班將採國內、國外二階段訓練,以 提高學習成效;第一階段於國內受訓4至8週,第二階段送至國 外受訓,請送訓單位先行編列選送學員出國預算。
- 二、 未來國內國際租稅班將改與美國加州州立大學合作,有關訓練主題並將於前一年底邀集賦稅署及各地區國稅局研提意見後,提供美國加州州立大學 Dr. Hsing Fang 及 Dr. Edward W.T Hsieh 參照,派遣適當師資來台教授。
- 三、 未來財訓所學員宿舍,將分年編列預算修整,原則上以參考本次 考察的加州州立大學洛杉磯校區設備為主。
- 四、 財訓所將設立聯繫窗口,持續與美國加州州立大學保持密切聯繫,洽談有關相互交流事宜。
