(Penang Apprenticeship Programme for Artisans)




The Penang Heritage Trust has initiated PAPA, a programme that actively promotes intangible cultural heritage, viewed as an integral part of the World Heritage Site's universal values. This involves assisting artisans whose skills are considered traditional to our Penang multi-cultural heritage.


The programme also views promotion, product development and assistance with marketing as integral in achieving sustainability of the skills

The PAPA project essentially:

- Identifies artisans who have traditional skills considered important for Penang's cultural heritage
- Assists these artisans with rental subsidies provided they agree to accept apprentices
- Identifies apprentices who show commitment to learning a traditional skill and use it as a career choice
- Assists apprentices with a scholarship and living allowance
- Provides an honorarium to the artisan to teach
- Provides assistance with marketing, promotion and product development
