It also requires a longer time to witness the effect on the development of related technologies and patents. To compound matters, there are 23 cases which are 3-year projects. Under such circumstances, the impact of the deficient budget will result in difficulty in smoothly completing the project. Hence, it is recommended that the project be continued after the expiration of its original execution period, in order to achieve the best effects of the project.
