2010 C-TPAT Cost and Savings Survey

The survey found the annual medians for the following:

Cost to implement: \$17,370

Cost to maintain: \$9,000

Cost Savings: \$5,350

Time savings: 373 work-hours

 Approximately 2/3 of respondents indicated savings either exceeded or equaled cost, and the remainder indicated that cost outweighed savings.

C-TPAT Study Finding:

 According to the companies surveyed, the real value of the program is being "responsible and reputable members of the business community"


Spotlight: Evaluation and Assessments Branch

- 2010 marked the first operational year of the EAB.
- Conducted 120 evaluations
- Outcomes:
 - Single, HQ-approved pre-validation questionnaire to ensure consistency
 - Identify training topics e.g. report documentation, security profile review
 - Improved compliance with internal controls and time frames
 - Conduit for member related concerns

Maintain Current Compliance Posture



- Suspended or removed 286 members due to an incident or failed validation
- 3 percent decrease in comparison with 2009
- 52 appeals were filed in which the member appealed the initial suspension/removal determination. 19 cases were denied and 33 cases were approved and the partners were re-instated into the program.
- Self-reporting of suspicious activity to CBP is pivotal component of the C-TPAT program




Taiwan AEO Program Objectives

- Implement the WCO Framework of Standards to Secure and Facilitate the Global Trade
- Establish a partnership with the trusted trader to increase supply chain security
- Provide proper security controls to ensure the protection of the local markets
- Provide facilitation to trusted trader having demonstrated compliant efforts to secure their part in international supply chain to facilitate free flow of legitimate goods

Taiwan AEO Legal Framework Development

- ◆ Revise regulations to implement AEO on Dec. 25, 2009
 - ✓ Revise "Regulations Governing Customs Clearance Procedures for Import/Export Goods of Authorized Traders" to "Regulations Governing Customs Clearance Procedures for Import/Export Goods of Authorized Economic Operators"
 - ✓ Taiwan AEO Program came into force
- Made amendment of the Customs Act on May 12, 2010
 - Revise Article 19 of Customs Act to include all supply chain operators
- Revise the Regulation again in line with the Act's revision in Dec. 31, 2010
 - Revise the Regulation to "Regulations Governing Validation and Management of Authorized Economic Operators"
