內容摘要:

行政院研究發展考核委員會代表我國加入國際政府資訊科技理事會 (ICA),於 2008 年第 42 屆年會加入計畫委員會,2010 年成為正式會員,並於 2011 年由我國主辦第 45 屆年會,本次會議係 2012 年第 1次會議,主要報告 2011 年第 45 屆年會辦理成果、討論 2012 年第 46 屆年會會議主題及 2013 年第 47 屆年會籌備情形。

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壹、目的

國際政府資訊科技理事會(International Council for Information Technology in Government Administration, ICA)係由各國中央政府機關所成立,與電子化政府等資訊科技應用有關之國際專業組織。行政院研究發展考核委員會(以下稱本會)代表我國加入該組織,於2008年加入計畫委員會,並於2010年經全體出席會員代表通過成為正式會員國,並於2011年由我國在臺北主辦第45屆年會。為履行會員國及計畫委員會成員之義務,爰由我國國家代表出席計畫委員會2012年第1次會議,並就2011年第45屆年會辦理情形,及2012年第46屆會議主題和2013年會籌備情形參與討論。

貳、過程

本次會議係由我國國家代表即本會資訊管理處副處長簡宏偉出席,會議期程為2月9日與2月10日計2天,第一天於英國電腦學會召開,第二天於英國政府內閣辦公室召開。出席人員包括ICA主席(加拿大) Peter Bruce 、副主席(以色列)Shimon Broner、副主席兼計畫委員會主席(新加坡) Mui Ken Chung 、前任主席暨比利時代表 Frank Leyman、ICA 財務長(英國)Larry Caffrey、ICA資深顧問(美國)Martha Dorris、美國代表 Darlene Meskell、韓國代表 Yoon-Seok Ko、加拿大代表 Pierre Boucher、英國代表 Sue Bateman、ICA 秘書 Janet Pearce 及我國代表等共12人;此外,為討論 Study Group 的進程,會中亦邀請了荷蘭代表 Jan Timmermans 和英國 Bill McCluggage 出席報告,議程如附錄1。

2月9日

會議自於 9 時起於英國電腦學會召開,第 1 天討論及報告事項包括下列項目:

- 1. 2011 年 12 月電話會議議題執行情形。
- 2. 2011 年第 45 屆年會辦理情形評估報告,如附錄 4。
- 3. Study Group 報告。
- 4. 討論 2012 年第 46 屆年會會議主題及議程。

晚間由主席邀請與會人員聯誼及意見交流。

2月10日

會議自 9 時起於英國政府內閣辦公室召開,討論及報告事項包括下列項目:

- 1. 持續討論 2012 年第 46 屆年會會議主題及議程。
- 2. 2012 年第 46 屆年會籌備情形,本年係由以色列主辦,預計於 10 月 22 日至 10 月 25 日於以色列首都耶路撒冷召開。籌備辦理情形由副主席 Shimon Bromer 報告會議場地、住宿地點,以及各項活動安排。
- 3. 後續年會辦理情形,由加拿大報告 2013 年年會籌備情形; 此外並討論 2014 年可能主辦的國家。
- 4. 討論 Capgemini 提案及歐盟電子簽章推動情形。
- 5. ICA 會務報告,包括網站更新、秘書業務、及財務收支情形, 以及未來領袖計書持續運作情形等。
- 6. 會員機制及本年選舉事宜。

會議於下午5時結束,下次會議將於5月29日及30日2天在 以色列耶路撒冷召開,期間並將視情形召開電話會議。本次會 議紀錄如附錄2,第46屆年會議程草案如附錄3。

参、各項討論重點

一、第 45 屆年會辦理情形評估報告

ICA 第 45 次年會係由我國主辦,共計有 50 位人員註冊,實際出席人數約 60 至 70 人,演講者及座談會與談人合計為 28 人。會議期間均有提供出席人員問卷調查,以做為未來次年年會之參考,本屆年會問卷回收率平均約為 48%。相關資料如附錄 4。

依據秘書回收出席者問卷調查的結果顯示:

- 1. 整體會議的滿意度有 86%表示非常好,14%表示很好;會場設施有 68%表示非常好,但是現場的無線網路斷斷續續的問題,是大家普遍反應有待改善的地方。
- 2. 會議資料有 74%表示非常好,議題的安排和進行的方式亦約有 超過 7 成表示非常好,但在時間的安排上則建議應有更多相

互討論的時間。

- 3. 在議題的部分,分組討論和技術新知二個議題評價較高;參 訪的部分則認為路程花費的時間略長。
- 4. 在演講者的部分,電子治理中心的陳敦源老師,在內容有用性、演講的品質,以及整體評價上均在前5名之內。

綜合本次出席者的反應,以及事後各國代表的感謝信,各國對我國主辦本次的會議均表示相當的滿意,甚至表示是歷年來辦理年會最成功的一次,而主辦第 46 屆年會的以色列亦坦言可能無法達到我國的水準。

至於在議題部分,普遍反應會議主題及進行方式良好,但在時間分配部分略顯不足,而且部分講者未能掌握時間,沒有充分時間可以討論;各國報告及分組討論是各國出席者覺得年會特別的地方,也是年會中評價較高的部分。

二、第46屆會議主題及議程

經過2天的討論,第46屆年會的會議主題定為聯結社會—縮短落差(Connected Society - Bridging the Gap)。隨著科技的進步,各項裝置均具有高度的智能和網路連結,例如手機、購物、甚至汽車等,均可以透過網路取得最新資訊,在高度連結的社會中,政府要如何經由高科技來服務民眾,滿足民眾的期待,同時保護民眾的隱私和資料的安全,是本屆年會所要討論的議題。

基於第 45 屆年會的調查,以及主題的確認,在第 46 屆年會中各場次的主題如下:

- 1. 聯結社會—縮短落差(Connected Society Bridging the Gap): 討論經由資通訊科技快速演化對政府所帶來的機會和挑戰。
- 2. 社會網絡(Social Media):隨著社交軟體的普及,政府在面對 政治、經濟和社會等方面的治理議題。
- 3. 巨量資料(Big Data):討論政府如何管理結構化和非結構化的

巨量資料,以及隨之而來的經濟效益,還有資料公開加值運用所帶來的創新服務。

- 4. 技術新知部分,將以現場展示為主,並以呈現各會員國使用 最新技術所帶來的創新體驗,或是在試做階段的初步成果。
- 分組討論分為2場,第1場是以治理、資訊安全和雲端服務 為主;第2場則是探討電子化政府服務遞送為主題。

其中我國將在社會網絡單元提供講者一人,基於電子治理中心在 本項議題已進行研究,建議可以在會議中報告研究成果和與會者 分享。

三、專題研究分組

本次會議除依例召開計畫委員會討論議題外,並邀請荷蘭代表 Jan Timmermans 提出 SSL 憑證的專題研究。本項研究係於 ICA45 年會中所提出,主要針對 SSL 憑證的有效性,以及對資訊安全 環境的衝擊,經出席代表同意,請 Jan Timmermans 提出細部構 想進行研商。

本次會議中,為確認本項專題研究符合 ICA 未來方向,爰邀請 Jan Timmermans 前來說明,本題專題預計包括下列項目:

- 1. 威脅分析(Threat Analysis)。
- 2. 基礎標準(Base Standards)。
- 3. 政府監督(Government Supervision)。
- 4. 事件管理(Incident Handling)。
- 5. 經濟因子(Economic Factors)。
- 6. SSL 憑證範疇內的替代機制或額外的信任機制(Alternative or additional trust mechanisms within the scope of SSL certificate)。
- 7. SSL 憑證範疇外的替代機制研究(Development of alternative techniques, outside the scope of SSL certificates)。

經過與會人員討論後,初步同意本項專題研究,並須於 ICA46 年會上提出初步報告。為提供我國經驗,已洽請技術服務中心派 員參與本項研究。

四、未來領袖計畫

為使各國能更積極參與 ICA 的活動,擴大各會員國參與機會,深化建立聯絡管道,ICA 每年均提供未來領袖計畫(Future Leader Program),由各國代表推薦具有發展潛力的年青資訊官員,經計畫委員會審查通過後,邀請出席年會。我國在 ICA45 係推薦財政部財稅資料中心周子元副組長。

本次在計畫委員會中有代表提案,為使每年邀請參與未來領袖計畫的人員能形成密切的聯絡社群,建議自第45屆的人員開始, 先以社交軟體 twitter 開始進行聯結,討論 ICA 未來發展建議, 再進而拓展到歷屆參與人員,並能對 ICA 提供適切的構想。

本項議題在會議結束後已聯絡周子元副組長,後續則由該員和其他人員進行討論。

肆、心得、建議及後續工作事項

一、心得

由於我國主辦ICA45年會在事前完善的準備,與現場調度和環境得宜,雖還有部分作業細節尚未臻完善,但整體而言,讓出席的各國與會代表對我國留下良好的印象,因此在會議中各國代表對我國的態度極為友善,對我國未來和各會員國之聯絡及促進合作等面向,均有助益。

其次,目前多數國家亦正開始推動次世代電子化政府計畫,例如新加坡、韓國、歐美國家,以及我國等,各國對於未來的發展亦以行動化、雲端、以及主動服務為主軸。尤其在主動服務的部分,目前正在試辦的基層機關e化服務宅配到家,是其他會員國都有興趣的創新服務模式,未來我國可以將本項試辦的經驗適當的加以整理,在年會中與其他國家進行經驗分享。

此外,本次會議中,包括前主席及現任主席也都在私下詢問我國未來擔任副主席的意願,並建議我國考慮承擔責任。

二、建議

出席本次會議後之建議事項有下列幾項:

- 1. 為維持我國與會員國之良好關係,並廣泛建立人際網絡,今 後仍可適時邀請會員國國家代表前來我國訪問,或前往該國 訪問,進一步了解及建立雙方關係。
- 2. 對於我國第 4 階電子化政府計畫推動經驗可以善加彙整,並 準備合適之簡報資料,於各項會議中提供經驗分享,有益於 未來從事各項國際活動之經驗推廣,並能進一步促進我國經 驗和各會員國交流。
- 3. 目前部分會員國代表亦同時兼任其他國際組織之聯繫窗口, 建議未來可在現有良好關係上,逐步拓展和其他國際組織之 交流管道。

三、後續工作事項

後續工作包括下列項目:

- 1. 出席本年 5 月於以色列耶路撒冷召開 2012 年第 2 次計畫委員會會議前,及本屆年會場地勘察。
- 持續參與本屆年會議題討論,及邀請和我關係良好國家,如 捷克、斯洛伐克,及泰國等,參與本屆年會。

1. Welcome address by ICA Chair

Peter Bruce, Chair of ICA, called the meeting to order at 9:15am, welcoming everyone and congratulating them on such a high turnout.

2. ICA 45th Conference: Lessons Learned

o Conference Evaluation Results

Mui Ken Cheung presented a slideshow on the feedback from the delegate's evaluation forms gathered at the 45th Conference, see appendix 1.

- Noted that the Taiwanese delegates augmented the conference numbers and that
 different attendees were present at various times; Shimon commented that Israel is
 planning to have twenty or so delegates from their government present and that
 these delegates will be registered, as they will attend all the sessions and the social
 functions.
- Noted that the comment on the country reports being late was not understood by anyone as the country reports were online before the conference. The country reports request will go out after the May meeting and it is expected to receive them by late September. (There is a time constraint where reports received in May

require updates and the logistics of reading and preparing the report summary for the beginning of October.)

ACTION – SECRETARIAT: include the Country Reports on the May meeting agenda.

- Discussion ensued on how to increase discussion time, as this is a perennial request
 of the conference evaluation forms, and it was decided to add time to the Country
 Reports and open this up for discussion on the previous panels of the conference
 agenda.
- Also we recognized there is a need to make sure all Panel Chairs are made aware of their responsibilities of time management. Set the tone early in the conference in the hopes that others will fall into place.

3. Study Group Reports

- Shimon gave a brief recap of the study groups' status post conference then introduced Jan Timmermans and his study group report on the topic of SSL Certificates, see appendix 2 and 3.
- As breaches are already known to have occurred, this is becoming one of the main issues for governments as well as end users. It is felt that this is becoming one of most important ICA study groups, with a large impact due to its subject matter and will boost ICA's reputation.
- Sue Bateman plans to draft a status report and submit it to the Board on her topic of Governance.
- In Taiwan, there were about fifteen people at the table discussing
 Governance –what is a useful matrix model. Over the next ten days Sue plans to
 contact those interested in participating for their input. She noted, while this is a
 large topic, it has fewer complexities than Jan's study group and meetings can
 most likely occur by video or teleconferencing.
- Pierre will provide Sue with two names, from government and one from academia. Canada is presently conducting a study on horizontal initiative in governance.
- It is felt that conceptually in the long term this topic has great importance and can become the national ICA governance model and prove to have great importance to other agencies such as the World Bank.

Although the third study group has fallen apart, as Larry noted, these two study groups are brilliant and their reports will generate more interest in future study groups at conference.

Martha suggested open data, with a narrowed scope, as a new topic for a study group.

ACTION – Jan Timmermans and Pierre Boucher: set up two plenary days in April or May.

ACTION – Jan Timmermans: to send a copy of his study group report to the Secretariat.

ACTION – Sue Bateman: over the next 10 days to contact those interested in the governance study group at conference and to outline a status report for the Board ACTION – Martha Dorris: to send information and suggested names for a leader, to Shimon for a possible study group on open data.

4. ICA Programme 2012, Jerusalem, Israel

- Mui Ken Cheung facilitated the discussion for the programme theme and agenda for the 46th Annual ICA conference in Jerusalem, see Appendix 4. See also the "Table of Action Items" following these minutes for all Action Items involved with the 46th Annual ICA Conference Agenda.
- Shimon reported that a company has been chosen, Ortra, who will take care of all logistics for the conference.
- The conference venue has now been chosen, the Inbal Hotel. It is recognized as one of the top four hotels in the Middle East.
- As well, two other hotels, the Dan Panorama Jerusalem and Prima Royal Jerusalem are available as alternatives for accommodation; both are in close walking distance and are more economical.
- Shimon presented a short video on Jerusalem that can be added to the ICA website.
- Social events will include visits to the Tower of David Museum and the Eucalyptus Restaurant, a tour by the Wailing Wall of an archaeological excavation, the Gala Evening at the Mercaz Shimson-Beit Shmuel, in the glass domed Blaustein Hall and a tour planned on Friday to the Masada.
- The accompanying person program is not set as of yet.
- A contingency plan in the event of any kind of trouble must be taken under consideration. It was decided that the deadline date for a decision on moving the conference will be September 1st.

ACTION – Secretariat: have the Jerusalem video uploaded to the website.

ACTION – Secretariat: Open the conference registration in June, after the next meeting. ACTION – Secretariat: when sending out the Conference Program Agenda, take out the speaker names so that it appears as an invitation to all countries to provide speakers where they feel it is appropriate.

ACTION – Board and Programme Committee: at the May meeting, plan for a contingency location for the 46th conference and have a skeleton plan in place for holding the conference either in Brussels or the UK.

5. Capgemini

Frank Leyman presented the Cappemini proposal for a joint research between Cappemini and ICA, dealing with a study on governments in cloud computing and how it is being implemented; see Appendix 5.

Capgemini plans to circulate a PowerPoint within its own organization and to ICA members. It is suggesting a co-branding on the published report. ICA members would be involved in a pre-study that will take about one hour of each participant's time. This will be followed up by a phone conference for members' input. Capgemini can present the results of the study at conference if it fits in the agenda.

This led to a discussion on ICA's involvement with business and its perception by ICA members. Peter felt we need to test some kind of model on joint research involving business with ICA, with terms and conditions that protect ICA's interests and provides a win-win for both sides. Frank commented that ICA has been vendor agnostic and perhaps we undertake this in a study group context where we partner with an outside company and where we exercise control on what the report says and where we remain completely independent. Howard noted companies have a working relationship with various governments and that this can be a new model for ICA study groups.

ACTION – Darlene Meskell and Pierre Boucher: work on a document and present it to the Board, outlining the rules of engagement for ICA to involve itself with businesses on study proposals. COMPLETED, see Appendix 5.

6. Future Leaders Programme

Peter noted how much the Future Leaders presentation was enjoyed by all the delegates at the last conference and he noted the need to solicit participation for the upcoming conference.

This led to a discussion on the purpose of inviting Future Leaders to conference. Consensus was that this introduced ICA to any upcoming Future Leaders, increasing ICA's visibility and as well it could be a vehicle to increase membership from non-member countries. The ideal model for Future Leaders at conference could be to have three, one from the host country, one from a non-member country and one from a member country.

The discussion then focussed on what is the expectation of ICA of its Future Leaders? The obvious answer is to have them as members of a Study Group. See also *Other Business*, *Social Media*.

ACTION – Peter Bruce and Secretariat: send past Future Leaders a yearly letter asking them what they have been up to and what their present ties with ICA are.

7. 2012 Elections

Elections are for a two year period and most present incumbents' terms run out this October. Larry noted that elections used to be once a year. Later the decision was made that the Board would sit for a minimum term of two years so that elections rarely take place every year. Larry noted the Chair takes a year to learn the job and it would be ideal if they stood for 3 years if they can manage it – realizing the toll it takes on their work and career.

Peter noted that the decision made to have the Past Chair remain a member of the Board has really helped a lot.

The present Board were all elected in Washington and elections will be held in October to either elect new members or re-elect present members.

• Martha has indicated her plan to remain as Strategic Advisor to the Board.

ACTION – Board and Programme Committee Members: consider standing for re-election in October.

ACTION – Board and Programme Committee Members: take to Council a request for procedural change, that the Chair's term is for a minimum of two years and a maximum of three years, with the support of Council, and that there is a need to have members of upcoming conference countries on the Program Committee.

8. Membership

- Peter has received a request for ICA membership from Moldova.
- Frank has also heard from Botswana they are planning to send an observer to the conference in Israel.
- Frank noted the World Bank is an associate member and suggested we ask one of them to speak in Jerusalem to assure that they attend.
- We can explore the possibility of the World Bank sponsoring some countries to come to the October Conference.
- We can invite Viet Nam to attend in Israel; discussion ensued over the rule on democratic countries as new members of ICA.
- Frank has the name of Warren Hero's boss and will remain in contact and invite him to the Jerusalem conference. Warren has advised Frank that ICA membership fees have been added to their budget.
- Portugal, Sweden, Austria and New Zealand are past members that did not pay their dues in 2011.
- Slovenia wants to be a member but cannot afford to pay their ICA dues.
- Cypress and Malta are paying members that have not been to conference.

• In 2011, there were 18 paying member countries and five non-paying member countries

ACTION – Peter Bruce: to reply to Moldova that, pending approval from Council in October, their membership to ICA has been accepted.

ACTION – Peter Bruce and Secretariat: to bring new wording to Council in October, with a better definition of 'democratic countries' as it relates to new membership in ICA. ACTION – Martha Dorris, Darlene Meskell and Pierre Boucher: to contact Mexico regarding membership in ICA.

ACTION – Frank Leyman: to contact Austria and Spain regarding membership in ICA.

ACTION – Pierre Boucher and Sue Bateman: to contact Brazil regarding membership in ICA.

ACTION – Howard Jyan: to contact Thailand regarding membership in ICA.

ACTION – Martha Dorris: to contact India regarding membership in ICA.

ACTION – Board and Programme Committee: all members are invited to send information on CIO's from various countries and to keep the Secretariat informed so that a database may be maintained.

ACTION – Peter Bruce and Secretariat: to look into the reasons why the Secretariat is assisting Service Canada in a research project on service delivery practices

10. ICA Conference – 2013 and beyond

- Presently it is not likely that South Africa will host for 2013 so we need to look for alternatives.
- It is possible for the UK to host in 2014.
- Peter and Pierre have been looking at the possibilities of Canada hosting in 2013; presently they do not have approval at this time to host in 2013. They are advising the Board and Programme Committee that it would be a conference held in an environment of budget restraints. Most likely the timing of the conference will coincide with the GTEC conference (Oct 8 11, 2013). Peter and Pierre are checking on ways of making this happen and are checking on possible venues for the conference as well.
- What happens if the Canadian hosting of the ICA conference cannot be moved to 2013? Perhaps Japan could be approached in light of their huge tourist campaign since the Tsunami? Darlene has spoken with Jan Timmermans on hosting the conference in the Netherlands; this would not be for 2013 but perhaps 2015.

• Perhaps ICA should look at building a Business Case, a proposal to Governments on the benefits of hosting an ICA Conference?

11. Other Business

o ICA Use of Social Media

Throughout the two days of meeting, discussion kept turning to the use of social media by ICA

Martha Dorris facilitated the discussion and noted the use of social media, e.g. Twitter, Facebook and LinkedIn accounts, can establish ICA as a place to go to learn and as a place where a lot of things are happening. Social media can pique interest and get ICA more exposure. It also breaks down the geographical barriers faced by ICA members. Martha has created a Facebook page and at the moment it is static. She feels we should

Martha has created a Facebook page and at the moment it is static. She feels we should all be tweeting at conference, that we should create hash tags for the conferences and that this will be an easy start to getting ICA involved with social media.

- Martha recommended we start with linkedIn; Frank felt this was something Vasilis would work on for ICA
- Mui Ken suggested that instead of putting presentations online, we could put up videos of the speakers on the website.

ACTION – Frank Leyman: to contact Gov2U about setting up a LinkedIn ICA account and to feed it on behalf of ICA.

ACTION – Frank Leyman: to look into Google Plus.

ACTION – Martha Dorris and Sue Bateman: to contact this and last year's Future Leaders and ask them to write a social media strategy, making recommendations and guidelines for ICA.

- Use of Teleconference Technology within ICA
- Ideas generated included webcam meetings, for example using Skype.
- Sue Bateman has access to a 90 minute Cloud Presentation webinar that could be uploaded to the ICA website.
- Frank is happy to set up a trial webcast; it could be with the Future Leaders.
- Frank reports that Vasilis is working on a restructure of the website and is adding video conferencing capabilities to it.
- Howard gave everyone copies of the videos taken in Taiwan. These could be converted, by picking out sound bytes, and go to website.

ACTION – Shimon Broner: to look into the feasibility of converting some of the 45th Conference videos into small vignettes or sound bytes to be posted to the ICA website. ACTION – Larry Caffrey and the Secretariat: to look into the possibilities offered by UK Freefone on video conferencing.

o Lapel Pins for Use at ICA Conferences

Larry reported the cost for lapel pins on a two to three hundred count order comes out to fifty cents each, and if we wanted lapel pins specific to each conference then the price would go up to about a dollar fifty each. There is a three week delivery time frame.

ACTION – Larry Caffrey: to order lapel pins, for the 46th conference, featuring the conference logo.

12. Summation and next meeting

Before closing the meeting on October 10th, Peter thanked everyone for their input and for the huge amount of work that was accomplished at this meeting. He then went around the table and asked everyone for their thoughts on the past two days. Most were very pleased with the group's energy and the amount of business we got through, praised Mui Ken for her facilitation and work on the Conference Program Agenda, and were happy to have the opportunity to network and work face to face.

Peter closed the meeting with a Thank You to Mui Ken for her work with the Conference Program Agenda and a presentation to Larry of a gift of Canadian whiskey for hosting the meeting.

The next meeting will be in Israel on May 29 and 30, 2012.



Overall Conference Rating




