摘要

出席「2011年全美州議會聯合會(NCSL)年會」報告

壹、前言

全美州議會聯合會 (The National Conference of State Legislatures,以下簡稱 NCSL) 係爲全美 50 州、7,382 位共和黨及民主黨州議員提供服務之跨黨派組織,每年 7、8 月間舉行國際性的立法高峰會議(Legislative Summit),由各州輪流主辦,邀請世界各國(地區)議員就教育文化、醫藥保健、生態環保、能源科技及財稅立法等議題進行探討,此爲 NCSL 每年最重要的活動之一,本(2011)年適輪由德克薩斯州(Texas)主辦。

德州是美國本土 48 州中面積最大的一州,也是全美第二大州,面積約爲臺灣 19 倍,1988 年 6 月 13 日與臺灣省簽約締盟,成爲本省第 30 個姊妹州 ,迄今已二十餘年,與我關係向來極爲友好及密切,2010 年 6 月 20 日德州州長 Rick Perry 曾率團抵臺訪問 3 天,並晉見馬英九總統。

貳、目的

- 一、貫徹政府總體外交政策,協助政府爭取在國際場合現身及發聲的機會,運用議會外交突顯臺灣之主體性,宣揚我民主及經濟成果,並爭取國際正義與友誼。
- 二、延續辦理自臺灣省議會時期以至臺灣省諮議會(以下簡稱本會)數十年議會外 交之傳統,積極鞏固與美國姊妹州會間友誼。
- 三、盲慰僑胞, 傳遞國內政經文化等訊息, 增加其對祖國之向心力及凝聚力。

參、過程

本(2011)年本會循例組團參加8月8日至11日於德州聖安東尼奧(San Antonio)舉行之「2011年全美州議會聯合會年會」,由魏早炳諮議員擔任團長,團員包括蘇主榮諮議員、陳光琛諮議員、李雪津秘書長及何若珍科長,在外交部北美司及駐休士頓台北經濟文化辦事處協助及陪同下,出席會議過程甚爲順利,謹將我團重點行程報告如下:

一、2011年8月8日(星期一)

(一)國際代表團迎賓會

我團在駐休士頓台北經濟文化辦事處陳彥夆組長陪同下,出席由 NCSL 主席-馬薩諸塞州參議員 Richard T. Moore 及副主席-新罕布什爾州眾議員 Terie Norelli 共同主持之迎賓會儀式,由李雪津秘書長向與會貴賓介紹我

團成員。

本(2011)年參加年會之國家除我國外,另有阿富汗、澳大利亞、奧地利、亞塞拜然、巴西、加拿大、中國大陸、象牙海岸、德國、印尼、肯亞、墨西哥、奈及利亞、葡萄牙、俄羅斯聯邦、沙烏地阿拉伯、南非、蘇丹、敘利亞、辛巴威等 24 個國家代表及來自美國各州議會議員,參加人數超過 4,800 人,場面熱烈浩大。

二、2011年8月9日(星期二)

首先登場的是 Bobby Henline, 2007 年他在伊拉克戰爭中受重傷, 臉部、耳朵及頭皮等身體多處遭灼傷, 左手肘之下被截肢, 但他並未因此消沉, 反而加入 Comedy Club, 希以自身的故事及幽默感激勵失志者, 全體觀眾均起立,以熱烈掌聲向他表達敬意。

其次由主講者 Jim Collins 發表演說,他於 2001 年發表暢銷書" Good to Great",之後又陸續寫作了包括"Built to Last"及"How the Mighty Fall: And Why Some Companies Never Give In,"等多本提供企業、組織領導者忠

告的書籍,當天特與全場貴賓分享他多年對於提升領導者層次方面洞察力的研究心得。

他將領導者界定爲5個層次:

1 · Level 1 : Highly Capable Individual

2 · Level 2 : Contributing Team-Member

3 · Level 3 : Competent Manager

4 · Level 4 : Effective Leader

5 · Level 5 : Executive


此外,Jim Collins 亦論及企業如欲永續經營必須擁有 BHAG (Big, Hairy, Audacious Goals),作爲驅動組織、實現願景的有力手段。而卓越的 BHAG 應包含以下三要素:

- 1、**BHAG 涉及很長的時間**。如 10 年、30 年或更長。其最主要的目的是要在一段很長的時間內,大幅且澈底地提升或改變企業的競爭能力。若 BHAG 的期間設定得不夠長,企業很可能會爲了追求短期的目標,而犧牲了長期的績效。
- 2、**BHAG 的含意必須很明顯、有強制性,且容易掌控。**領導者訂定 BHAG 的目的應是顯而易見,不容易混淆的明確目標。
- 3、BHAG **能緊密連結企業的核心價值與目的。**應與企業根本的價值及創業宗旨相互呼應。

然而,他強調重點不在於訂定 BHAG,而端視企業能否長期致力於追求達成 BHAG,亦即檢視該企業有無建立催化機制的觀念與決心。

Jim Collins 以豐富的表情、多變的肢體語言闡述成功的領導者及企業的要件,令全場觀眾留下深刻的印象。

(二)參訪德州議會大廈

德州議會大廈位於該州首府-奧斯汀,距離聖安東尼奧約1小時20分鐘車程。大廈完成於1888年,外型採文藝復興時期建築風格,1986年以"對美國歷史的特殊意義及貢獻"被指定爲國定古蹟,其面積爲所有州議會中最大者,僅次於Washington,D.C.國會大廈;內部涵蓋參、眾兩議院、最高法院、刑事上訴法院及1915年即成立之州立圖書館(現爲立法參考書閱覽室)等。

三、2011年8月10日(星期三)

(一)全體會議

首先全體觀眾起立爲擔任最後一次太空梭飛行任務的亞特蘭提斯號 Capt. Christopher Ferguson 等 4 位太空人鼓掌。



亞特蘭提斯號Chris Ferguson、Doug Hurley、Sandy Magnus、Rex Walheim(由右至左)4名太空人 之後由德州州長 Rick Perry 發表演說,他認爲聯邦政府應給予州政府 更大的權力及自由,以解決他們自己的問題。他很自豪的宣布:即使在經濟不景氣期間,德州的工作機會仍成長;過去兩年來,德州提供全國 40%的工作機會。德州現正致力於推動減少繁瑣費時手續的政策,希望小型企業能賺到更多的錢。事實上,政府無需創造工作,只需創造就業的環境,而交由私部門創造工作,因所獲得之利益非僅屬於個別家庭,而是屬於整個社會的。Rick Perry已於 8 月 13 日宣布角逐共和黨總統候選人提名,正式加入 2012年總統選戰。

- 四、美國民主制度實施已久,人民的民主素質普遍極高,對於民主、共和兩黨意見不一致時,彼此共聚一堂協商尋求共識之作法,值得借鏡。





When Texas was annexed by the United States in 1845, it took two statewide elections to keep Austin the capital city.
	In 1888 Austin's capitol building was built, advertised as the "7th largest building in the world." In addition to the city's landmark, Austin is historic in that its original avenues and street plans remain very much the same as when they were built. In 1893 the city of Texas constructed the Great Granite Dam on the Colorado River. The dam stabilized the river and provided hydraulic power to generate electricity, which in turn attracted manufacturers.
	In addition to Austin's advances in technology and manufacturing, it is also home to much political success. Barbara Johnson, citizen of Texas, became the first African American woman to be elected to the Texas State Senate, where she served from
	1966 to 1972.
