- to understand better the processes by which they are nurtured, used and enjoyed



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ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

- 1. Leadership and Governance is it well-managed, inclusive, fair?
- 2. Local Character does it have a distinctive sense of place, identity & cultural resonance?
- 3. Amenity is it an attractive, safe & enticing place for people to live, work and play
- 4. Commercial Success & Viability does it provide a conducive environment for wealth creation & distribution, and the maintenance & improvement of its urban environment?
- **5. Environmental Sustainability -** does it show & promote environmental sustainability?
- 6. Community, Health and Wellbeing does it show & promote civic behaviour, social cohesion, health & wellbeing?
- 7. Connectivity does it provide physical and ICT-based access options to a range of urban services?


Lisbon: new Development Permit system

- 2012 Masterplan identified
 11 priority investment
 areas
- credits can be transferred from original location to 1 of priority areas
- credit value can be increased by 20% for consistent good performance
- credits can now be traded→ new commodity market

- early community engagement -"ma ville..."





Autumn: public vote on confirmed shortlist


Winter: decision & public presentations of winning projects


