摘 要

「國際政府資訊科技理事會」(International Council for Information Technology in Government Administration, ICA)由各國中央政府機關於1968年成立,為電子化政府等資訊科技應用有關之國際專業組織,目前成員國共計26個國家,旨在提供各國電子化政府創立、發展與執行之交流平台。我國前由國家發展委員會代表以臺灣名義加入,於2010年經全體出席會員代表通過成為正式會員國,並於2011年在臺北主辦第45屆年會。

本(49)屆年會於 9 月 6 日至 9 月 9 日在瑞典斯德哥爾摩舉行,由國發會領隊,本次會議主題為啟動行動化政府-面對社會挑戰(Unleashing mobile government - addressing societal challenges),藉由與各國代表會議討論,就各國推動經驗進行交流,並分享各國推動的電子化政府策略與政策內容,並討論在此施政過程中所帶來的挑戰。

本次會議並由財政部資訊中心代表本國,就電子發票應用議題進行簡報,分享我國電子發票的寶貴經驗,引起各國代表很大的興趣,對於推廣本國 ICT 應用於公共事務產生的資訊科技公共價值效益,有莫大的幫助。

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
壹、 出國目的:

第 49 屆國際政府資訊科技理事會」(International Council for Information Technology in Government Administration, ICA) 於 9 月 6 日至 9 月 9 日在瑞典斯德哥爾摩舉行。為瞭解各國現行資訊科技創新服務應用,並促進國際交流,藉由各國代表互相討論,分享各國推動電子化政府之策略與政策內容,討論在施政過程中所帶來的挑戰。

此次年會由國發會領隊,並由財政部資訊中心、政大電子治理研究中心以及本部資訊處陪同出席觀摩。本次會議主題為啟動行動化政府-面對社會挑戰(Unleashing mobile government - addressing societal challenges),透過參加 ICA 年度會議,分享我國電子化政府經驗並且汲取他國實務經驗,將我國政府電子治理經驗與歐美先進國家進行交流,學習及瞭解各國各項創新科技與政府電子治理發展之趨勢,期能導入創新規劃設計,以增進國際交流互動機會,促進並拓展我國外交國際空間。

貳、 過程及會議討論重點:

2015 年 ICA 第 49 屆年會於 9 月 6 日至 9 月 9 日於瑞典斯德哥爾摩舉辦,由國發會領隊,並由財政部資訊中心、政大電子治理研究中心以及本部資訊處陪同出席, 共計 5 人,行程如下表(議程詳如附錄):

本次會議主題為啟動行動化政府-面對社會挑戰(Unleashing mobile government - addressing societal challenges),包含下列重要討論議題:

- (一). 策略與變革管理(STRATEGY & CHANGE MANAGEMENT)。
- (二). 以市民為中心整合行動技術(INTEGRATION OF MOBILE TECHNOLOGIES WITH CITIZEN-CENTRIC APPROACHES)。
- (三). 政府分析大數據(GOVERNMENT ANALYTICS FROM BIG DATA)。
- (四).網絡安全如何保護數位世界的公民(CYBERSECURITY TO PROTECT OUR CITIZENS IN THE DIGITAL WORLD)。
- (五). 啟動 m-政府(ENABLING mGOVERNMENT)

本屆年會過程說明如下:

一、9月6日下午:

- (一). 召開計畫委員會(14:00-14:45): 本國由國發會會員代表出席。
- (二). ICA 會員代表大會(14:00-14:45): 由與會各國代表及副代表出席,本國由國發會會員代表出席。
- (三). 新成員介紹(17:45-18:15):由主席向新出席成員針對 ICA 年會進行簡報與介紹。
- (四). 晚上 ICA 會員出席歡迎晚宴,大會於斯德哥爾摩市政廳宴請各國出席代表。

二、9月7日:第一天包括下列專題演講及討論

- (一). 本次會議主題為**啟動行動化政府-面對社會挑戰**(Unleashing mobile government addressing societal challenges),由於網絡安全對於保護我們在數字世界公民日趨重要,政府必須將資安風險將到最低;而大數據的的議題,全世界各國的政府正如火如荼的展開研究,而且最重要的是,如何應用此新興的技術來協助施政規畫作並出符合社會公民預期,是政府面對新型數位社會的挑戰。
- (二). 第一個議程是**策略與變革管理**(STRATEGY & CHANGE MANAGEMENT), 這幾年 一系列新資訊科技的出現,使得政府企業現有基礎設施和組織人力資源,產生變

- 革,特別是兩者之間的相互作用的產生的實際影響未受到應有的重視。實施全面的 IT 總體規劃,結合業務流程的需要和新技術使用是十分重要。
- (三). 本議程首先由瑞典社會安全局的首席資訊長針對瑞典社會安全局之資訊總體規劃,說明其如何藉由 IT 協助進行決策與數位化策略來增加其服務效益,在安全無虞的情況下,提供簡單並更高的可信度,更多自動化服務,並建立更緊密的機構間合作。接著由 IBM Nordic 歐洲聯盟業務發展執行部針對現代化政府所面臨新結構性的挑戰,新型態數位公民要求更有效率的服務,如何因應並滿足更多民眾導向的服務,最後由以色列 Prime Minister's Office 的首席資訊長針對其2015~2018的 ICT 策略進行簡介,包括其政府 ICT 的進化,構成一個以公民為中心的政府,以透明和高效率來促進創新,創造更多公眾利益。
- (四). 第二個議程是以市民為中心整合行動技術(INTEGRATION OF MOBILE TECHNOLOGIES WITH CITIZEN-CENTRIC APPROACHES),當新移動技術整合到民眾、企業和政府之後,將產生許多變化,從民眾的日常生活到政府的政策制定,尤其在政府公共領域與民眾生活將引起新形式的接觸和關係。尤其智慧型手機對公共和社會產生了極大的創新影響,和廣泛的創造機會。因此,需要新的以公民為中心的方法與策略來驅使政府決策,才能滿足公民和企業的預期需求,轉變成成新的合作夥伴關係。
- (五). 本議程首先由瑞典 e-政府實驗室(eGovernanceLab)針對政府如何進行群眾外包 (Crowdsourcing),說明以公民為中心相對於以公民驅動的治理之間的差異,包括 行動裝置的角色、社會運動所引起的政府治理結構如何改變來應對新的挑戰。接 著由新加坡政府首席資訊長以建置公民為中心的電子化政府為主題,介紹新加坡 政府如何從自動化、電子化服務、整合性服務到協同合作的電子化政府,提供創 造更美好生活,更多數位機會和縮小數位落差為願景。最後由 Mobileam 的首席 資訊長提出如何提供給新移民一個全方位的新服務的思維。
- (六). 第三個議程是**政府大數據分析**(GOVERNMENT ANALYTICS FROM BIG DATA), 由於大數據議題正夯,整整兩個小時演講和討論,期盼從彼此的經驗中學習。例 如在世界各國政府有什麼大數據來源以及從那些社交媒體的推斷。同時發現通過 物聯網(IOT),可以導入新挖掘技術來管理和分析如此巨大量的數據。而最重要 的是政府如何利用這種新興的技術領域作出政策決定,並達到公民社會的預期。
- (七). 本議程首先由加拿大農業部所資助的 TRACECANADA 之執行長,分享加拿大對境內的畜禽進行追蹤服務(Agri-Traceability Services),建立世界級的國家畜禽溯源服務的任務。接著由瑞典斯德哥爾摩大學電子治理實驗室(eGov lab, DSV)介紹大數據的 3V(Volume 巨量、Variety 種類與 Velocity 速度)特性,並說明電子化政府面臨的挑戰與限制及所帶來的機會。緊接著是由本國代表財政部財稅中心張志龍高級分析師上台,介紹台灣為了解決逃漏稅,從紙本發票演進到電子發票,有效監視並具備彩票般樂趣的政策,並且利用大數據提供食品生產鏈結上下游關連度,確保民眾食品安全與消費者利益,讓與會者對台灣印象特別深刻。接著是摩爾多瓦(Moldova)電子化政府中心執行長,介紹其身份識別技術(Identity resolution),透過集中服務技術(MNotify、MPass a 及 MConnect),以特定上下文的處理與迭代方式變換不同類型的身份,可以在不同的事件將通知發送給不同的身份。最後一個是 Gavagai 公司的首席資訊長介紹大數據分析的定義與問題,以及應用在選舉與

全球情感分析(Global Sentiment Analysis)。

- (八). 第四個議程是網絡安全如何保護數位世界的公民(CYBERSECURITY TO PROTECT OUR CITIZENS IN THE DIGITAL WORLD),由於網絡攻擊明顯提升,各國政府都一致將網絡安全的優先重要性提高。即使世界各地的政府投入大量資源來保護公民的數據資產,卻仍然很容易因為一個不知情的員工或承包商無意行為而遭受損害。
- (九). 本議程首先由歐洲網絡與信息安全局(ENISA: European Network and Information Security Agency)介紹歐盟的網絡安全戰略,包括網絡安全是社會和經濟運作良好的重要基礎、關鍵服務和基礎設施應該得到更好的保護以免除網絡攻擊和威脅、加強關鍵資訊基礎設施保護。接著由荷蘭內政部高級政策顧問介紹荷蘭網絡安全重點,包括其網絡安全、網路安全組織架構、網絡安全評估與國家網絡安全戰略。緊接著由荷蘭阿姆斯特丹英特爾安全部門(Intel Security Group)介紹數位化政府公民面對那些的網絡風險以及應該具備的安全戰略基礎,最後由烏拉圭(Uruguay) AGESIC 的董事會成員分享該國 ICT 與電子化政府的發展經驗,以及其網路安全的策略。

三、9月8日:

(一). 上午到達西斯塔科學城(Kista Science City),參訪易利信體驗中心(Ericsson Experience Center)。



- (二). 接著進行第五個議程是**啟動 m-政府**(ENABLING mGOVERNMENT),主要聚焦於 政府事務應用與創新。大多數政府收集和發布大量的數據,卻因為有限的資源而 無法以創造性與參與方式到公民手中。
- (三). 首先個別分組,一共3組,分別為遷移(Migration)、風險與災害管理(Risk & Disaster Management)以及建造房子(Building a house),並且分別依照10年前、目前以及10年後,不同情境去思考。分組討論持續到下午,最後3組各選出一個最佳方案後,再簡報給所有成員。

四、9月9日:

- (一). 第六個議程為各國報告(COUNTRY REPORTS),第七個議程為未來的領導者 (FUTURE LEADERS)。第八個議程(最後一個議程)為與北歐國家的聯席會議,旨在強調在一個共享的基礎設施下,北歐在歐洲單一數位市場的潛力。同時通過培育一個開放式創新的生態系統,實現共同創造共同的服務會導致創造就業,經濟增長和高效的政府。
- (二). 本議程共有兩個主題,主題一為共享基礎設施的北歐朝著單一數位市場,分別由 瑞典 KIVRA 的首席資訊長、丹麥財政部以及南非微軟技術總監進行簡報。主題 二為開放式創新--北歐生態系統,分別由愛沙尼亞政府辦公室數字化政策顧問、 新加坡資訊通信發展管理局局長以及瑞典斯德哥爾摩大學法律與信息學教授進 行簡報。
- (三). 最後為閉幕式,由以色列經濟部高級首席信息官擔任主席,並由美國 ICA 特約顧問進行本次年會的總結,第 50 屆 ICA 年會將於哥倫比亞舉行,閉幕晚宴透過享受傳統的瑞典美食,完美畫下句點。

參、 心得及建議:

這次非常高興有機會可以出席第 49 屆的 ICA 年會,除了陪同觀摩之外,也有機會瞭解各國政府在 ICT 上的應用與發展。針對大會安排的幾個議題,有以下的心得:

一、心得:

- (一). 政府應更加重視新資訊科技的引入:科技已是民眾生活的一部份,新資訊科技在 這幾年更是有突破性的進展,除了智慧型手機的普及、網路的暢通,公民社會的 發展,使得政府的施政面臨很大的挑戰。政府應該更加思考與民眾生活息息相關 的部分,例如:物流、金融、運輸、醫療等等,如何更加善用新資訊科技的引入, 來改善民眾的生活,才能讓民眾有感。
- (二). 電子化政府應加速因應科技潮流:從許多例子都可以看出資訊科技不但對企業界提供了競爭優勢,也可能造成一個國家社會產生結構式的改變,因為科技造成民眾工作習慣改變、顧客與供應商關係改變、產品與服務的成本結構改變以及工作效率的提升。面臨如此巨大的改變,電子化政府更應該思考如何因應這一波的新科技海嘯,藉此來提升政府的施政與布局。
- (三). 加速縮小數位落差:儘管新型資訊科技正如火如荼的展開,世界各國仍存在很大的資訊數位落差,許多民眾對於資訊科技仍然十分陌生。以報稅為例,目前透過網路報稅僅為85%,表示仍有15%民眾仍然採取傳統方式報稅,追究其原因,除了少部分特殊原因以外,其餘大多是因為資訊數位落差,而無法採用網路報稅。其他因為民眾在資訊取用能力上的落差與區隔,相對使得民眾無法取得政府政策與相關福利措施,將造成更多立足點的不平等,甚至影響社會均富與公平正義。
- (四). 如何迎接大數據與物聯網的來臨:當網路普及之後,人類在此 10 年內網路上的 種種活動所產生的資訊量,已經遠遠超過人類過去所累積的資訊量。面對如此巨

大的資訊,行動科技已經趨使網路時代走入新紀元,再加上各種物件彼此相互連結「物聯網」誕生之後,整個數據規模將進入前所未有的世代。新一代的電子化 政府要如何因應這樣的世代,並想像會引起如何的變革,是我們即將面臨的功課。

- (五). 政府如何加速創造數位機會:上述的大數據時代來臨,除了思考政府如何因應之外,究竟會創造如何的數位機會?現行的教育制度所提供的知識,是否已經無法滿足這樣的知識爆炸時代?傳統產業的沒落,政府如何利用科技來協助其轉型,新興的網路時代,政府如何加速創造數位機會?當世界各國同時迎接網路世代的來臨,誰能掌握資訊科技所產生的數位機會,就能提升國家的競爭力。
- (六). 資通安全是網路交易的磐石:當政府提供越來越多的資訊化服務之後,網路交易需要更高等級的資通安全防護,尤其在網路的虛擬世界中,各種駭客、詐騙行為,現代化政府除了要加強各部會的資通安全防護之外,更必須加強如何防範未來更多的網路非法交易行為,才能保障民眾的交易安全。

二、建議:

本次出席會議之後有下列建議:

- (一). 鼓勵本部資訊人員出席相關國際會議,增加與各國交流機會,在共通的資訊領域 彼此經驗分享,並藉由面對面強化外語交談。
- (二). 大數據為世界各國時勢所趨,本部未來可多派同仁參加相關研習,多方面吸取新知,加強文化與大數據的結合與應用。
