New international requirements to obtain a verified gross weight of a shipping container









- New requirement come into force 1st July 2016 following a number of high profile disasters
- All packed shipping containers to have a 'verified gross weight statement' provided to the 'Master of the Port' prior to being loaded onto a vessel to be used in the stowage plan
- Intension is to provide a fair commercial platform for all exporters and strengthen the health and safety protection for the vessel, road vehicles transporting containers and port workers







Method

One

weighing the packed container using calibrated and certified equipment

Method two

 Weigh of all the goods using a certified method approved by the competent authority and sum the gross weight of all items in the container with the tare weight of the container
























Improving the accuracy of New Zealand's milk collection instruments

Milk collection company collects up to 15 billion litres of milk p/a

Previous system:

- 2000L & 400L measures
- Scale intervals 1 Litre
- Flowmeters verified against 'working standards' of volume







Example 1 - Continued

Reference Volume Measures

- Standardised measures
- Increase in volume and improved repeatability



A new Indicator

- 0.1 L interval for calibration
- User interactive with additional check facilities for the operators
- Easy access to calibration history
- Facilitates management activities









ISO 9001 Accreditation

- Attained ISO 9001 accreditation
- Documenting all processes procedures for trade measurement
- TELARC certification body
- Provides consistency and continuous improvement









Excess fluid in chicken meat

- W&M requires goods be compliant at 'point of sale' not 'point of manufacture'
- Initial sampling exercise to determine level of excess fluid
- Findings revealed
 - Cuts of chicken up to 8%
 - Whole, raw chicken up to 12%
- Excreted fluid absorbed in 'soaker pad'
