Project Synopsis

This study will illustrate the best practices implemented by APEC economies regarding the enforcement of UNCAC's provisions on Asset Recovery. This study will make possible to APEC economies to learn from each other and, to coordinate their actions in order to implement Asset Recovery provisions and have better results on this issue. Therefore, sustainable benefits from this project will necessarily be gained and spread among all APEC economies.

Corruption is a problem that has severe negative impacts in all APEC economies because it hinders sustainable development, equitable growth, and social stability. Besides, corruption distords competition of interntional trade.

The APEC Anti Corruption and Transparency Working Group (ACTWG) have also specified their commitment to fight corruption in various documents, including the Santiago Commitment to Fight Corruption and Ensure Transparency (2004) and more recently the Beijing Declaration on Fighting Corruption (2014). Both of these documents emphasize the importance of working towards implementation of punitive anticorruption policies and practicies consistent with the UN Convention Against Corruption (Santiago Committment) and the use of existing legal instruments such as the United Nations Convention Against Corruption (Beijing Declaration). Hence, it is important to monitor how APEC economies are implementing this legal instrument.

The United Nations Convention Against Corruption has a chapter dedicated to Asset Recovery (Chapter V) that aims to promote international efforts to facilitate the return of assets derived from corruption. Therefore, the study will consider the enforcement of UNCAN's provisions on this issue

The Anti-Corruption and Transparency Working Group has approved a Multi-Year Strategic Planning 2013 – 2017, which recognizes seven key themes to cooperate within APEC. One of these seven key themes is precisely "to implement APEC anti-corruption commitments, including the United Nations Convention against Corruption". The ACT Work Plan for 2016 is committed to continue to promote and strengthen the implementation of existing APEC commitments, including the UN Convention against Corruption.
