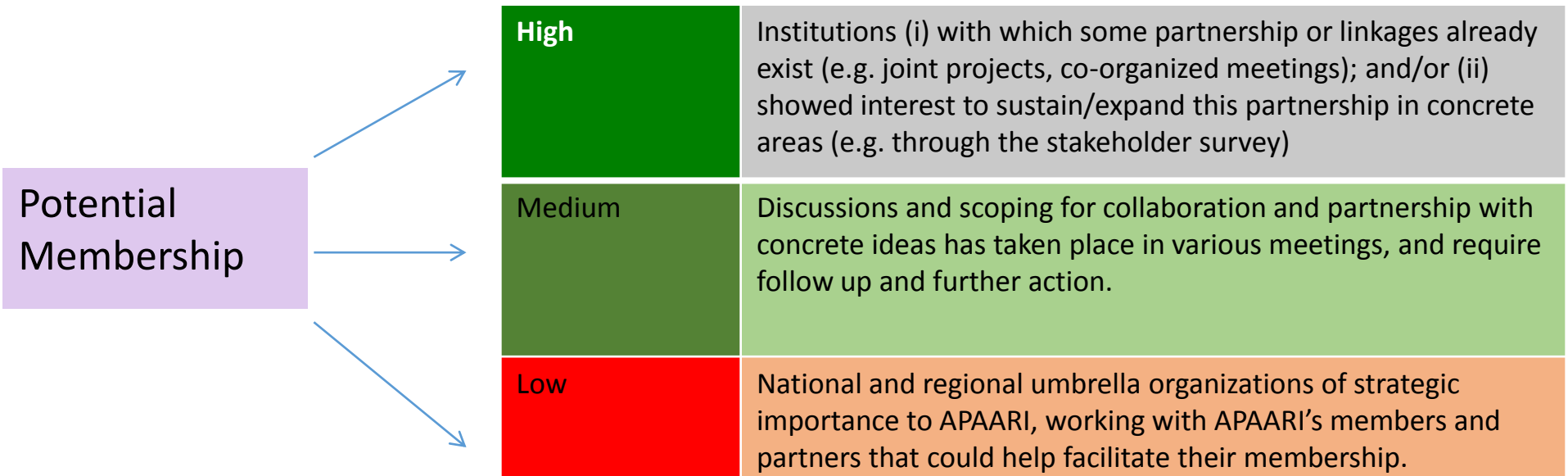

- In March 2002, FAO Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific (FAO-RAP) and APAARI jointly organized an “Expert Consultation on the Status of Biotechnology in the Asia-Pacific Region” and in December 2002, APAARI organized an “Expert Consultation on Strengthening of Research Partnerships through Networks and Consortia” in Panang, Malaysia.
- Recommended for the establishment of an Asia-Pacific Consortium on Agricultural Biotechnology.
- APCoAB established on April 4, 2003.

- To facilitate and promote the process of greater public awareness and understanding relating to important issues of IPRs, *sui generis* systems, biosafety, risk assessment, harmonization of regulatory procedures, and benefit sharing in order to address various concerns relating to adoption of agricultural biotechnology.
- To facilitate human resource development for meaningful application of agricultural biotechnologies to enhance sustainable agricultural productivity, as well as product quality, for the welfare of both farmers and consumers.

Proposal to Expand activities in APCoAB

APAARI proposes that 'Asia-Pacific Consortium on Agricultural Biotechnology' may be renamed as 'Asia-Pacific Consortium of Agricultural Biotechnology and Bioresources' with earlier acronym as APCoAB to expand the scope of work of existing APAARI-COA program with commensurate funding and manpower.

Justifications:

- Asia-Pacific region is very rich in bioresources which are key elements for food and nutritional security of the region. In view of the same, under APCoAB, it was recommended in previous EC meeting - “Agri-biotechnology program needs to put more focus on bio-prospecting of bioresources.”

- Biotechnological tools are very effective in bioprospecting of bioresources.

- Capacity building and knowledge sharing to use biotechnological approaches for bioprospecting is very essential to fully exploit the potential of bioresources.

- Awareness about international developments about the access to bioresources and benefit sharing from their use will enhance the prospects for sustainable food and nutrition security in the region.

Justifications:

- In revised work plan (2018-2020), activities would be expanded related to bioprospecting of bioresources, which very well fit in the priority Theme No. 1 (Development outcome # 1.3 and 1.4) of APAARI.

- Expansion of activities would depend upon commensurate manpower and funding and active involvement of NARS.

- Coordinator, APCoAB, has also vast experience in area of bioprospecting of bioresources using biotechnological tools.
