#### Animal husbandry in the Netherlands

- 3.9 million cattle
- 900,000 veal calves
- 🐃 12 million pigs
- 🐨 500,000 horses
- 1.5 million sheep and goats
- 100 million poultry

#### The Dutch Agri & Food sector

- 10% of GDP
- 10% of labour force
- €42 billion added value
- 2nd exporter of agri products worldwide
- Exports to more than 170 countries
- The Netherlands produces 5x more than EU average

# The Dutch livestock sector



#### Dutch dairy sector

- 18.100 dairy farms (2.8% of EU)
- 1.5 million dairy and calf cows (6.5% of EU)
- Average milk production/farm 636,000 kg
- Total milk production: 11.9 billion kg milk (7.8% of EU)
- 51 dairy plants, 21 companies
- Contribution to economy: €6 billion (1.2%)
- Major player in international market:
  - EU market share milk production: 7.8%
  - Global market share: 1.9%

#### Dutch pig sector

- 100 million people consume Dutch meat daily
- 15.3 million pigs slaughtered yearly
- Pork export: €2.4 billion
- Pork export outside EU: €500 million
- 13.000 people work in the Dutch meat processing industry





#### Dutch beef and veal sector

- Beef and veal export: €2.5 billion
- 1.5 million veal calves slaughtered yearly
- 570.000 cattle slaugthered yearly
- Export to more than 60 countries worldwide

#### Dutch poultry sector

- 576 broiler farms (4% of EU)
- 47 million broilers
- 580 million slaughterings yearly
- Poultry meat production: 986,000 tons
- 20 large poultry slaugtherhouses
- 30 large meat cutting premises
- Export per year:
  - Volume: 1.5 million tons
  - Value: €2 billion
  - Destination: 75% to EU member states, 25% to countries outside the EU





#### Dutch egg sector

- 1,060 laying hen farms
- 34.8 million laying hens
- 10.5 billion eggs per year
- 78 egg packing centers

#### Bovine Genetics

- 5 EU certified bovine semen collection centra
- 3.2 million bovine artificial insemination in the Netherlands per year
- 3.2 million doses of semen exported
- Export to 80 countries



#### Porcine Genetics

- 25,000 breeding pigs held on 55 farms
- Producing replacement gilts for Dutch market
- 4.7 million porcine artificial insemination in the Netherlands per year
- Export of genetic process and knowledge

- Top Veterinary Policy Advisor to the Minister for Agriculture on animal health
- Animal disease crisis management
- OIE Delegate
- Chief Veterinary Trade representative



#### Animal Health Policy in the Netherlands

- Adopting policy goals from EU Directives
- For animal health, if necessary, additional national legislation is made
- Based on 3 pillars:
  - Prevention
  - Monitoring
  - Control
- Adopting measures in consultation with private sector
- Crisis Preparedness and training:
  - 24/7 availability of crisis structure
  - Goal crisis management: eradicate disease safeguarding products

- Faculty of Veterinary Medicine in Utrecht
- 70% in general practice
- 360 vets work at the NVWA
- All farmers have a 1 to 1 relation with their private veterinarian
