### Veterinary Border Controls in the Netherlands

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### **Import controls at the EU border**

The Directorate for Inspection is responsible for the import controls at the EU border for:

- Live animals
- Products of animal origin
- Food
- Feed
- Consumer products

in co-operation with Dutch Customs based on agreement with the Ministry of Finance









### By import the NVWA means import from 3<sup>rd</sup> countries



The **1**<sup>st</sup> countries are the EU member states

The 2<sup>nd</sup> countries are those who have special arrangements with the EU, like Norway and Switzerland

The **3<sup>rd</sup>** countries is the rest



### Main tasks of team <u>Import</u>/Export

- Implementing European legislation in procedures and instructions
- Training Border inspection post (BIP) teams and customs
- Support visits from SANTE F or 3<sup>rd</sup> countries
- Participation in EU Working Groups in Brussels
- Preparing advice for SCOPAFF

Directive 97/78/EC





### Specific EU Legislation on import requirements The Big 5

- Decision <u>2007/275/EC</u>: animals and products subject to controls at border inspection posts under Council Directives 91/496/EEC and 97/78/EC
- Regulation (EC) 206/2010: import of live ungulates and their fresh meat
- Regulation (EC) 798/2008: import of poultry and poultry products.
- Regulation (EC) 605/2010 : import of milk and milk products.
- Decision <u>2006/766/EC</u> : import of fishery products



# **New** Official Controls Regulation (EU) 2017/625

- The Official Controls Regulation (EU) 2017/625 addresses official controls and other official activities performed to ensure the application of food and feed law, rules on animal health (Regulation 2016/429) and welfare, plant health and plant protection products (Official Controls Regulation - OCR)
- The OCR repeals Regulation 882/2004 and the Directives 91/496 and 97/78



### **Principles of border controls**

- Guarantees on Public Health / Animal Health by the veterinary certificate from 3<sup>rd</sup> country
- Veterinary checks have to be carried out in EU approved Border Inspection Posts (BIP's)





### **Border Inspection Post (BIP)**

- Approved by European Commission after proposal by the Member State.
- In The Netherlands, BIP facilities are owned by private

companies.

- human- / non human consumption
- temperature- / not temperature related

\*Categories for animals:

- equines
- ungulates
- other animals

### **Import process**

**Pre-arrival:** summary declaration is send by the shipping line to the customs authorities.

<u>**Pre-notification**</u> before arrival on <u>Common</u> <u>Veterinary Entry Document (CVED part I).</u>

CVED is send by person responsible for the load (customs agent) on behalf of the importer.



### **Documentary checks**

Carried out by Customs under responsibility of NVWA.

In case of non-conformity handed over to official veterinarian.







### **Identity checks**

Visual inspection to ensure that the veterinary certificate corresponds with the boxes of the consignment, like country name/ISO-code and establishment number





### **Physical checks**



Reduced checks can be applied on harmonised products, based on EU-risk assessment (Decision 94/360/EC).

Laboratory check is part of the physical check.



### **Laboratory checks**

- Based on National plans (residues / microbiology)
- According to specific EU-Decision.
- REC, re-enforced checks (art. 20 & 24 Dir. 97/78/EC).

Carried out by central NVWA-laboratory in Wageningen or they transfer it to other laboraties.





### **Destination of veterinary consignments**

- EU-member states (internal market, free circulation)
- Transit to Third country (Non-EU)
- Storage in Free Ware house (products)
- Transhipment (EU-member state / third country)





### **Result of the veterinary checks**

Consignments can be:

- <u>Acceptable</u> for internal market/transit /transhipment
- <u>Detained</u> (temporary blocked)
- <u>Refused</u>
  - Re-export (products) / Re-dispatching (animals)
  - Destruction (products) / Euthanasia (animals)
  - Transformation (products) / Quarantine (animals)



### **Instructions, procedures, information**

EU legislation concerning import is translated to instructions, procedures and implemented in an online information system: *Import Veterinair Online (IVO)* 

On the website of the NVWA the import from 3<sup>rd</sup> countries is publicly available (in Dutch)

### Support of the import process by CLIENT-Import or VGC

Possibility of scanning relevant information of the consignment that can be linked to the CVED in the system:

\*Health certificate
\*Result of laboratory checks
\*Pictures of the container, boxes etc. (in case of problems)
\*All relevant correspondence



### Advantages VGC

- Electronically information about status of consignments
- Support import process
- Database can be consulted for queries
- Electronically file for all consignments checked in the BIP
- ⇒ all the information in VGC is transferred to TRACES





### TRACES

- •The Member States have to enter <u>all CVED's</u> in TRACES
- Every consignment destined for the Netherlands is visible

⇒ TRACES prevents importers from port shopping because the implementation of the Re-enforced checks, the art 20 &24, is EU wide
