Background information on Import control

Europe consists 28 member states

Within the EU a single market is in place

There is free movement of persons, goods and money.

One of the tools the EU applies is developing legislation. EU law - which has equal force with national law - confers rights and obligations on the authorities in each Member State, as well as individuals and businesses





Background information on Import control

The competent authorities in each Member State are responsible for implementing EU legislation in national law and enforcing it correctly,



There is specific legislation in place to ensure food and consumer safety at the moment of entry and import into the EU



Background information on Import control

All member states are responsible for checking:

Production



Import



Processing



Export





Background information on Import control

Import is considered to include all consignments entering the EU in originating form from non-EU member states.





EU Regulation: Type of controls

Import control offers three different backgrounds:

1. National monitoring plan



2. Harmonised monitoring plan



3. EU emergency measures





EU Regulation: Type of controls

Article 15.1 882/2004



National
control plan



The competent authority shall carry out regular official controls on feed and food of non-animal origin, imported into the EU.

It shall organise these controls on the basis of the multi-annual **national control plan** drawn up in accordance with Articles 41 to 43 and in the light of potential risks. The controls shall cover all aspects of feed and food law.



EU Regulation: Type of controls

Harmonised monitoring plan

A list of feed and food of non-animal origin that is, on the basis of known or emerging risk, to be subject to an increased level of official controls at the point of entry into territories of the EU.



Emergency measures for food and feed of Community origin or imported from a third country





Harmonised and harmonised with certificate country of origin

Prior notification to the competent authority is needed.

Common entry document

Official controle:



Article 2 of the EU regulation 882/2004

'official control' means any form of control that the competent authority or the Community performs for the verification of compliance with feed and food law, animal health and animal welfare rules;



Whom: Skilled people, suitable equipment *882/2004*



CHAPTER III

TRAINING OF CONTROL STAFF

Article 51

Training of control staff

1. The Commission may organise training courses for the staff of the competent authorities of Member States responsible for the official controls referred to in this Regulation. These training courses shall serve to develop a harmonised approach to official controls in Member States. They may include in particular training on:

- (a) Community feed and food law and animal health and animal welfare rules;
- (b) control methods and techniques, such as the auditing of systems that operators design to comply with feed and food law, animal health and animal welfare rules;
- (c) controls to be carried out on goods imported into the Community;
- (d) feed and food production, processing and marketing methods and techniques.

Official controle



'official control':

any form of control that the Member State or the Community performs for the verification of compliance with feed and food law, animal health and animal welfare rules

'documentary check':

the examination of commercial documents and, where appropriate, of documents required under feed or food law that are accompanying the consignment

'visual check':

a visual inspection to ensure that certificates or other documents accompanying the consignment tally with the packaging, labelling and temperature, the content of the consignment

'physical check':

a check on the consignment which may include checks on the means of transport, on the packaging, labelling and temperature, the sampling for analysis and laboratory testing and any other check necessary to verify compliance with feed or food law



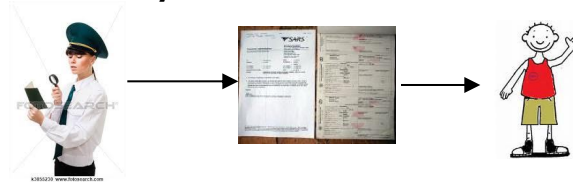
Release for free circulation

If all checks are finished and the results are conform

The competent authority sign the CED



The competent authority handover the CED to the food business operator.



The food business operator go with the signed CED to the customs.



Customs release the shipment for free circulation in the EU





Overview cooperation customs.

- Two moments of cooperation:

National control plan:

- selection from custom manifest



Harmonized & harmonized with certificate:

- Customs Check of all controls are done at the moment of import declaration
