摘要

本(108)年「糧食安全政策夥伴(PPFS)」第 1 次會議暨「糧食安全政策 夥伴-海洋漁業工作小組(OFWG)聯合會議」於 2 月 23 日至 25 日在智利聖 地牙哥召開,我國由行政院農業委員會溫技正祖康及江技士筱慧偕同中央 研究院經濟研究所張研究員靜貞參加。

本年 2 月 23 日至 24 日召開「第 13 次 PPFS 會議」,主辦經濟體智利報告本年規劃之 PPFS 工作重點及行動計畫,各工作小組及經濟體說明本年本年度 APEC 糧食安全優先議題、各項提案及預定辦理活動,以及本年 8 月 17 日至 22 日 APEC「糧食安全週 (Food Security Week)」、本年 8 月 23 日至 24 日「第 5 屆糧食安全部長會議 (5th FSMM)」等相關事項進行討論,其中糧安部長將討論「永續糧食系統」、「糧食安全數位機位」、「強化區域糧食貿易」及「鄉村發展機會」等 4 項議題。本年 2 月 25 日召開「PPFS-OFWG聯合會議」,透過跨領域會議,加強各論壇/工作小組資訊分享及合作。

我國於會議期間,分享我國降低糧損多年期計畫成果,獲多個經濟體及主席肯定,此外,我國報告 2019 年 APEC「降低糧食損失與浪費,以因應 APEC 區域糧食安全及氣候變遷(Reducing Food Loss & Waste (FLW) for Addressing Interlinked Challenges of Food Security and Climate Change in APEC Member Economies)」自費計畫,獲下屆(2020 年)主辦經濟體馬來西亞、下下屆(2021 年)主辦經濟體紐西蘭及越南支持,盼成為本年度糧食安全週及「第5屆糧食安全部長會議」亮點,並列入本年部長宣言。

貳、 前言

近年國際糧食安全議題受到高度重視,尤其全球暖化日益加劇、極端氣候造成的天災異常頻繁,直接衝擊 APEC 區域內糧食安全;2009 年 APEC 領袖會議呼籲各會員體集思廣益,共同研擬穩定區域糧食安全之策略,自2010年起,「糧食安全」即持續列為 APEC 之優先領域。

本(108)年 APEC 會議主辦經濟體智利訂定年度主題為「聯結人群,建 構未來」,4 大優先領域如次:

- (一) 「數位社會 (Digital Society)」
- (二) 「整合 4.0 (Integration 4.0)」
- (三) 「婦女、中小企業及包容性成長 (Women, SMEs and Inclusive Growth)」
- (四) 「永續成長 (Sustainable Growth)」

本年 SOM 層級計畫,包括 Bogor Goals、後 2020 願景及其他預定活動。

參、 糧食安全政策夥伴(PPFS)會議

一、 第1天:2月23日

- (一) 各會員分享與 PPFS 議題有關之進展及資訊:
 - 1. 澳洲強調數位農業對糧食生產及糧食安之重要性。
 - 加拿大強調公私部門對漁業發展及農產貿易自由化、氣候 變遷及維護糧食安全的重要性。
 - 3. 智利說明新政府農業政策強著重在鄉村農業發展、強化糧 食安全、品質成長、提升收入及市場進入等面向,並致力 於農民能力建構。
 - 4. 中國報告去年公私部門在改善穀物品質及提升營養等成果,包括去年 12 月間在深圳舉行之「小麥品質國際研討會 (International Wheat Quality Symposium 2018)」,計有來自澳洲、紐西蘭、俄羅斯、美國等專家與會,就穀物供應鏈管理、促進營養與提升附加價值、穀物標準與檢測技術,以及運用育種增進穀物營養之經驗進行分享。
 - 5. 印尼報告提升穀物、漁業、畜產及資通訊技術等提升糧食品質、促進鄉村發展之政策及計畫成果,盼 2020 年前提升鄉村經濟收入 20%及強化糧食安全。
 - 6. 日本報告智慧農業,包裝設施農業運用雲端及自動灌溉系統及自動插秧機等技術應用,以及去年在巴紐辦理「強化亞太地區小農及微中小型企業市場進入 (Seminar on Enhancing market entry for MSMEs including micro, small and medium holders)」研討會之成果。
 - 7. 韓國報告 2016-2020 年農漁業新興政策,強調環境友善農業 生產、品質提升及改善配銷系統等。
 - 8. 馬來西亞報告該國自 2011 年推動農業及糧食安全相關政策、 行動計畫及能力建構等活動,期能提升農民收入 5%以上, 並盼在 2020 年擔任 APEC 主辦國,能與各經濟體密切合作。
 - 9. 紐西蘭感謝智利對永續發展及女性在農漁業參與的重視, 表示該國亦著重相關議題,並再次強調投資環境、數位機 會改善糧食系統及糧食營養的重要性,並分享該國長期致 力氣候變遷調適、水資源管等研究計畫。

- 10. 菲律賓報告糧安議題等政策,包括去年國內糧食安全高峰 會成果、提升國內糧食自給相關措施、公私部門合作等, 並盼在 2020 年將該政策推行至 1,680 個地方團體。
- 11. 新加坡表示,該國糧食安全相關政策著重糧食產業、食物銀、減少貿易障礙、提升當地農產生產及相關科技之應用。
- 12. 我國報告簡介我國農漁業與糧食安全相關之政策、法規及 創新技術最佳範例。
- 13. 泰國報告永續稻米生產政策,以降低溫室氣體排放;降低糧食損失及浪費管理,將執行相關措施,降低在糧食在加工、配銷及零售端之浪費,並達到 SDG 12.3 目標;介紹「農業公私部門夥伴最佳範例分享,以促進城鄉連結 (Public-private Partnership in agriculture to share good practice on enabling rural-urban linkages)」規劃。
- 14. 美國介紹與女性包容性、強化城鄉發展、提升創新數位機會及農業相關國內、國際計畫與政策,包括本年 2 月通過之「全球女性經濟培力倡議 (U.S. Government's Global Women's Economic Empowerment Initiative)」。
- 15. 越南說明該國最新農業政策並重申支持糧食安全之立場。
- (二) 城鄉發展促進糧食安全與品質成長行動計畫:
 - 1. 智利農業部農業研究及政策局 Director Ms Maria Emilia Undurraga 報告「農村發展機會 (Rural Development as a place of Opportunities for economies)」,智利近年推動農業政策新主軸(new paradigm),其中城鄉發展連結分為經濟、空間及管理等 3 大架構,認為鄉村應有自我發展機會而非把人帶到城市發展,此外,智利鄉村人口約佔 29%,其中貧窮人口約佔 37.4%,其鄉村發展策略分為中央、次中央(subcentral)及地方等 3 級(level),推動相關政策並適時追蹤成效;另外,著重糧食生產,提升鄉村地區整體經濟發展。
 - 2. 智利「強化鄉村發展以促進亞太地區糧食安全 (Strengthening rural areas as a contribution to Food Security in the Asia Pacific Region)」計畫指出,鄉村發展 4 大挑戰包

括鄉村發展政策、新能源發展、糧食生產創新技術及城鄉 連結,將於本年6月舉辦2天活動,邀集相關領域專家分 享最佳範例,研擬共同文件等。

3. 泰國報告「農業公私部門合作,以促進鄉村都市鏈結最佳範例分享(Public-Private Partnership in agriculture to share good practice on enabling rural-urban linkages)」,將於本年 5 月 29-30 日在 Chanthaburi 省舉辦,邀集 APEC 公私部門討論城鄉發展政策與經驗分享。

4. 其他會員發言:

- (1) 馬來西亞支持永續農業及糧食安全,資源管理,氣候變 遷調適等議題。
- (2) 新加坡盼與智利進一步分享農業灌溉相關技術及經驗。

(三) 降低糧食損失及浪費相關計畫:

- 1. 我國降低糧損多年期計畫成果分享:由張研究員靜貞報告相關成果,指出 APEC 經濟體公私部門在降低糧損上面臨基礎建設、糧損意識不足、政策制定、執行效率及合作不佳等挑戰,呼籲 APEC 應思考 2020 糧食安全路徑圖下一階段目標,此外,簡介我國擬提「降低糧食損失與浪費,以因應 APEC 區域糧食安全及氣候變遷」自費計畫內容,盼各經濟體支持。紐西蘭表示支持我國自費計畫,馬來西亞盼與我國進一步就降低糧損及浪費交流。
- 2. 日本 APEC 補助計畫「應用 ICT 及創新科技降低糧食浪費 (Reducing Food Waste by Using Information and Communications Technology (ICT) and Innovative Technologies)」預計本年7月在東京召開,邀請各經濟體私部門分享運用 ICT 降低糧食浪費等相關經驗。馬來西亞表示盼與日本就糧食浪費交流。

(四) 服務業及糧食系統計畫:

紐西蘭報告「服務業及糧食系統計畫」,包括 APEC PSU 研究及私部門經驗 2 項工作主軸,並將於 2021 年舉辦「(Services and the food system workshop)」,探討公私部門在服務業及糧食

系統面臨之障礙及經驗,PSU指出,糧食系統不只是糧食生產,糧食供應鏈服務業角色日漸重要,如:ICT服務業、配銷服務業、金融服務業等,PSU一下階段將就運輸服務業及法規面研究,並提出相關政策建議。

(五) 女性在農漁養殖業之參與:

- 1. PPWE 主席報告「性別包容及女性經濟培力 (APEC Gender inclusion and women's economic empowerment priorities)」本年預定辦理之相關活動,包括我國 APEC 補助計畫「提升智慧農業性別包容 (Workshop: APEC GIFTS A+: Promoting Gender Inclusion in Smart Agriculture (GIFTS: Gendered Innovation for Technology and Science))。
- 2. 智利區域計畫及管理主任 Catalina Toro Parot 報告「促進和發展婦女基金會之觀點 (Testimony from the Foundation for the Promotion and Development of Women (PRODEMU)),該基金會推動"rural women program"訓練計畫,協助原住民女性及家庭農戶能力建構。
- 3. 我國發言表示我國重視婦女投入農業部門對產業帶來的效益,並協助女農縮短在科技運用上之差距,並邀請各會員 參加我國規劃於本年9月召開之「提升智慧農業性別包容」 相關活動。

(六) 強化糧食安全相關活動之機會:

- 智利報告該國強化糧食安全之措施,包括強化個人農戶競爭力及能力建構。
- 2. 紐西蘭概述「1990 年商品徵稅法(Commodities Levies Act 1990)」內容,以達到促進產品生產研究發展、行銷、動植物保護、品質管理、產業發展、教育及知識宣傳的目標。

二、 第2天:2月24日

(一) 數位機會以促進糧食安全:

1. 智利報告「數位機會以促進糧食安全」背景資訊,接續由 智利農業部農業研究及政策局 Stanley Best 及 José Luis Molina, Hispatec 說明觀察報告,指出氣候變遷影響智利農 作物生產、生產及勞動成本,加上近年消費者對農產品品質及生產流程透明化等市場要求,促進社會及環境永續發展及利益,智利開始運用科技及大數據協助農業生產,建立新商業模式,並提供新服務業型態,以達到提升農業生產力、降低農業生產成本、促進環境保護及增加農產品利潤之目的。

- 2. 韓國報告「智慧農業倡議及永續成長」3 年期自費計畫 (2017~2019 年),「運用資通訊技術智慧農業訓練班 (Training Program for Smart Agriculture Using Information and Communication Technology)」成果,並暫訂於本年6月12-13日在首爾辦理「運用ICT之智慧農業範例,以促進永續成長工作坊 (Workshop on Smart Agriculture Practices Using ICT for Sustainable Growth)」,將進一步邀請各經濟體分享運用ICT最佳範例及提出政策建議。
- 3. 馬來西亞、加拿大、中國、新加坡及我國發言表示 ICT 對促進糧食安全、城鄉發展、提高農業生產力及農民收入,以及促進資訊透明化之重要性,並支持智利及韓國計畫。
- 4. 美國指出該國政府不主導 ICT 技術運用政策, 而是交由市場及商業機制決定。

(二) 2019年糧食安全倡議及計畫:

- 1. APEC 秘書處簡介 APEC 補助計畫申請要點及流程,強調計畫主題應扣合年度主題、APEC 策略或申請之子基金主軸, 爭取各經濟體支持、跨論壇合作及強調對 APEC 區域的助益等,每年有 2 次申請時間,分別為前一年 12 月及本年 6 月。
- 2. 去年共有114項計畫申請APEC補助,計有46項獲得通過(約40%),去年第2階段期間僅智利申請APEC補助計畫「強化鄉村地區發展以促進亞太地區糧食安全 (Strengthening Rural Areas as a contribution to Food Security in the Asia-Pacific region)」。

(三) 各工作小組報告:

- 1. 第1工作小組「永續農漁業發展」:
 - (1) 新加坡籍主席陳金轉報告, WG1 有 5 項進行中計畫、2

項計畫已完成及 3 項擬執行計畫,包括新加坡與智利合作計畫「精準農業無人機運用 (Use of Drone for Precision Farming)」、「溫室抗熱 PE 膜運用(Use of Anti-thermal PE film for Green House)」,以及與 APEC 中心合作之「新式箱網養殖發展 (Development of New Floating Cage concept fish farm)」。

- (2) 智利簡要報告智利農業研究機構(Chilean National Institute of Agricultural Research, INIA)工作內容及相關計畫。
- 2. 第2工作小組「促進投資及基礎建設發展」:由主席中國國家糧食局長韓繼志報告,WG2本年優先議題將聚焦「APEC Internet and Digital Economy Roadmap」,包括數位基礎建議發展、提升技術及服務業創新應用、強化電子商務及促進數位貿易合作,並將請各經濟體提供運用數位創新技術促進糧食安全之最佳範例。
- 3. 第3工作小組「強化貿易及市場」:
 - (1) 小組主席日本私部門代表木村毅報告去年活動辦理情形及本年規劃,包括紐西蘭小農因應非關稅措施(NTM),以及日本將於本年8月糧安週期間,在智利巴拉斯港辦理自費計畫「促進亞太地區小農及微中小型企業市場進入之系統及機制研討會 (Seminar on Systems and mechanisms to enhance entry of MSMEs into local, regional and international Markets)」。主席並強調將持續邀請私部門參與APEC相關活動。
 - (2) 日本報告去年辦理「強化亞太地區小農及微中小型企業市場進入(Seminar on Enhancing market entry for MSMEs including micro, small and medium holders)」研討會成果。智利、印尼及加拿大發言強調市場進入對維護糧食安全之重要性,並表示支持。
 - (3) 紐西蘭表示樂意就 WG3 有關原住民及機能食品貿易及 促進糧食安全等經驗與各經濟體分享。

- (四) 「第5屆糧食安全部長會議(5th FSMM)」籌備:
 - 糧食安全週時程規劃及行政安排:本年8月17-22日辦理各項工作坊/研討會,8月18日ATCWG會議、8月19至20日PPFS會議、8月22日PPFS-OFWG-ATCWG-HLPDAB聯合會議,以及8月23至24日5thFSMM。
 - 2. 5th FSMM 將討論「永續糧食系統 (Sustainable Food System)」、「糧食安全數位機會 (Digital Opportunities for Food Security)」、「強化區域糧食貿易 (Enhancing Food Trade in the Region)」及「鄉村發展機會 (Rural Development as a Place of Opportunities for Economies)」等 4 大領域。
 - 3. FSMM 宣言架構及 2020 年後糧食安全目標等文件,將於明日 PPFS-OFWG 聯合會議初步討論,並預計在本年 5 月、7月及 8 月送各會員評論。

 - (四) 智利說明該國去年 10 月辦理「小型漁業及養殖創新產品之全魚利用以達糧食安全目的之經驗交流 (Exchange of experience to add value to organic waste from small-scale)」計畫降低漁產品損耗及浪費,以及再利用之成果,並盼與我國進一步分享相關經驗及技術。OFWG 主席肯定我國降低糧損多年期計畫之成果。
 - (五) 智利報告「打擊IUU以促進糧食安全 (Fighting against IUU fishing: a contribution to Food Security)」, 並指出 IUU 對 APEC 區域糧食 安全(包括糧食生產及生態環境等)造成不利影響,並盼相關成果

及建議能提至更高層級會議宣言。俄羅斯發言支持智利。

(六) 巴紐報告「女性在農漁及養殖業之參與 (APEC women on agriculture, aquaculture and fisheries)」之成果,紐西蘭發言強調女性參與的重要性,智利亦說明該國本年提出相關計畫,盼能協助女性在漁業參與並提升甚經濟地位。

二、 Beyond 2020:

- (二) 智利表示海洋廢棄物、女性參與及糧食損失及浪費等議題在本 次 OFWG 會議經充分討論,並將持續推動該等議題與糧食安全 之連結。OFWG 主席支持智利規劃。

伍、 心得與建議

- 一、我國本年「降低糧食損失與浪費,因應 APEC 區域所面臨之糧食安全及氣候變遷的挑戰 (Reducing food loss and waste for addressing interlinked challenges of food security and climate change in APEC member economies)」自費計畫,探討議題與聯合國永續發展目標 SDG12.3 高度連結,獲下屆(2020年)主辦經濟體馬來西亞、下下區 (2021年)主辦經濟體紐西蘭及越南支持,並對我國之後續規劃表達高度興趣,我方應持續投入相關研究並加強與會員合作,以擴大我方在此議題之影響力,並盼成為本年度糧食安全週及「第5屆糧食安全部長會議」亮點,以及列入本年部長宣言。
- 二、日本邀請我國派員參與本年7月在東京辦理之APEC補助計畫「應用 ICT 及創新科技降低糧食浪費(Reducing Food Waste by Using Information and Communications Technology (ICT) and Innovative Technologies)」研討會,並分享我國降低糧損多年期計畫成果。我國將持續與各經濟體合作,爭取相關成果納入本年 5th FSMM 宣言。
- 三、 APEC 近年愈趨重視跨論壇合作,透過聯合會議,有效宣傳我國降 低糧損多年期計畫成果,未來將持續利用相關平台推動計畫,並 爭取會員之支持及參與。




