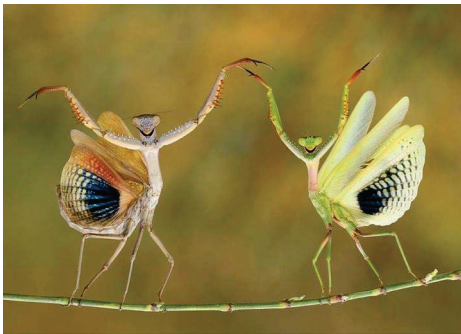

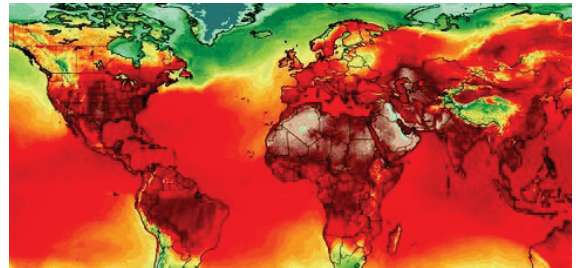

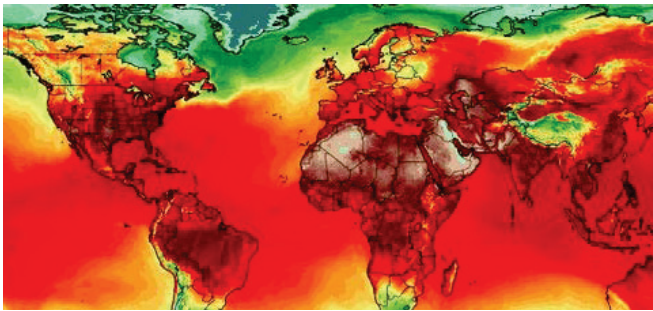

Red-hot planet: All-time heat records have been set all over the world during the past week

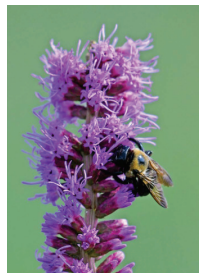
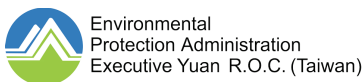

The Birth of a Field

Tbilisi Declaration: EE is a learning process that increases people's **knowledge** and **awareness** about the environment and its associated challenges, develops the necessary **skills** and **expertise** to address the challenges, and fosters **attitudes, motivations,** and **commitments** to make informed decisions and take responsible **action**.

- Action





Environmental Education

Why the GEEP? **Geep** GLOBAL ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION PARTNERSHIP

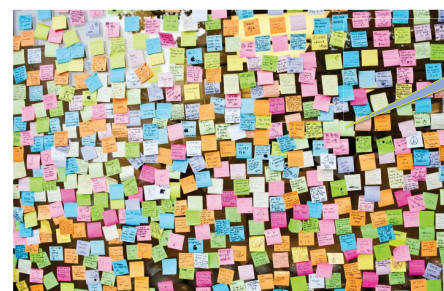
- Trying to fill a gap and complement, not duplicate
