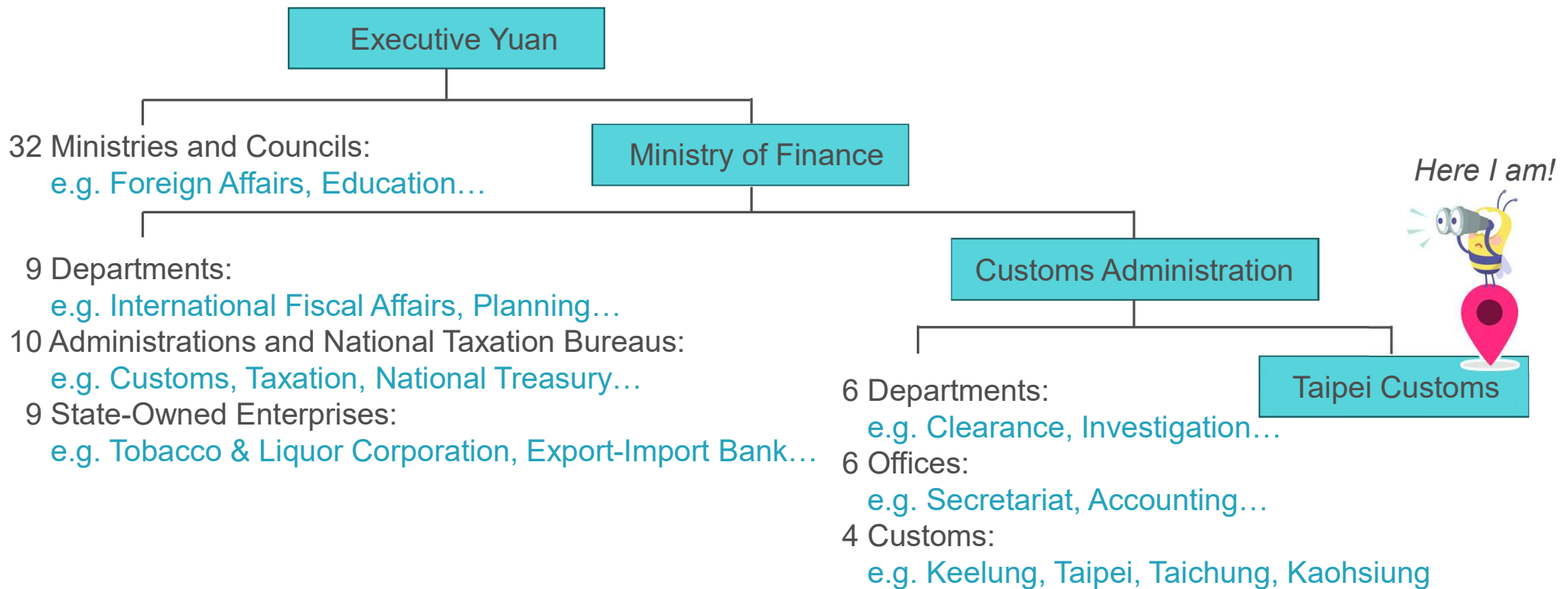

Location of DG and Regional Customs

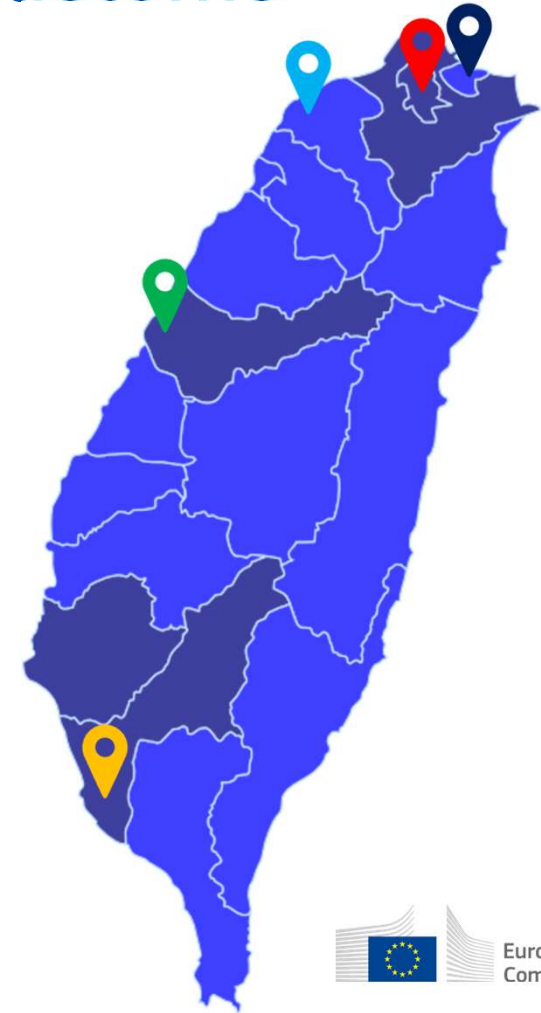

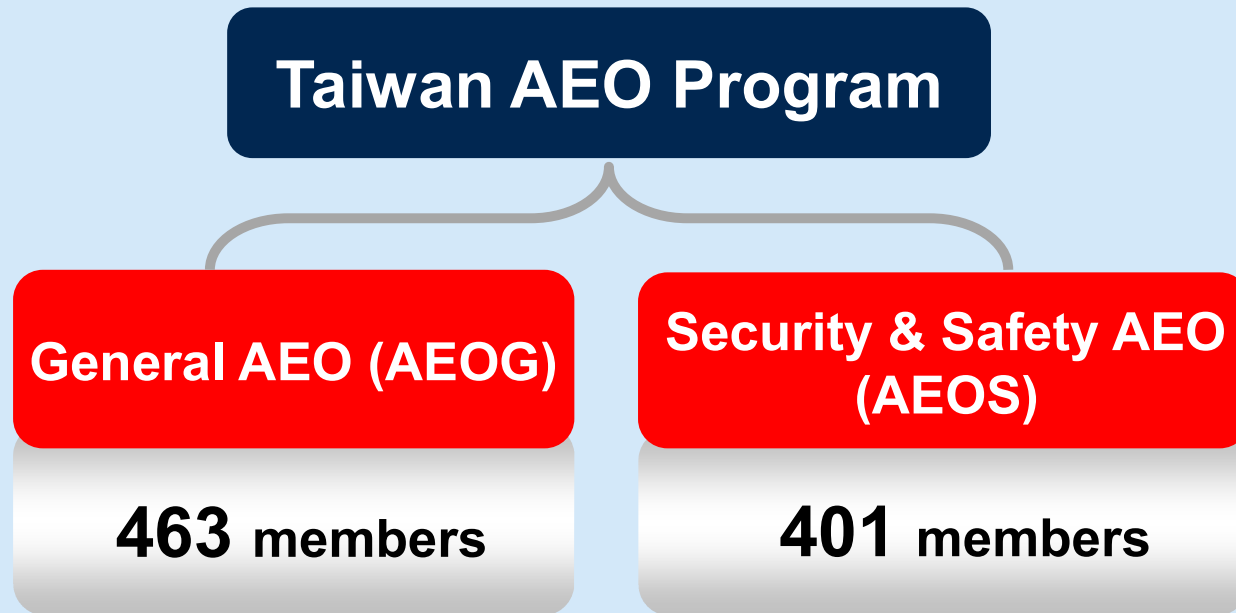

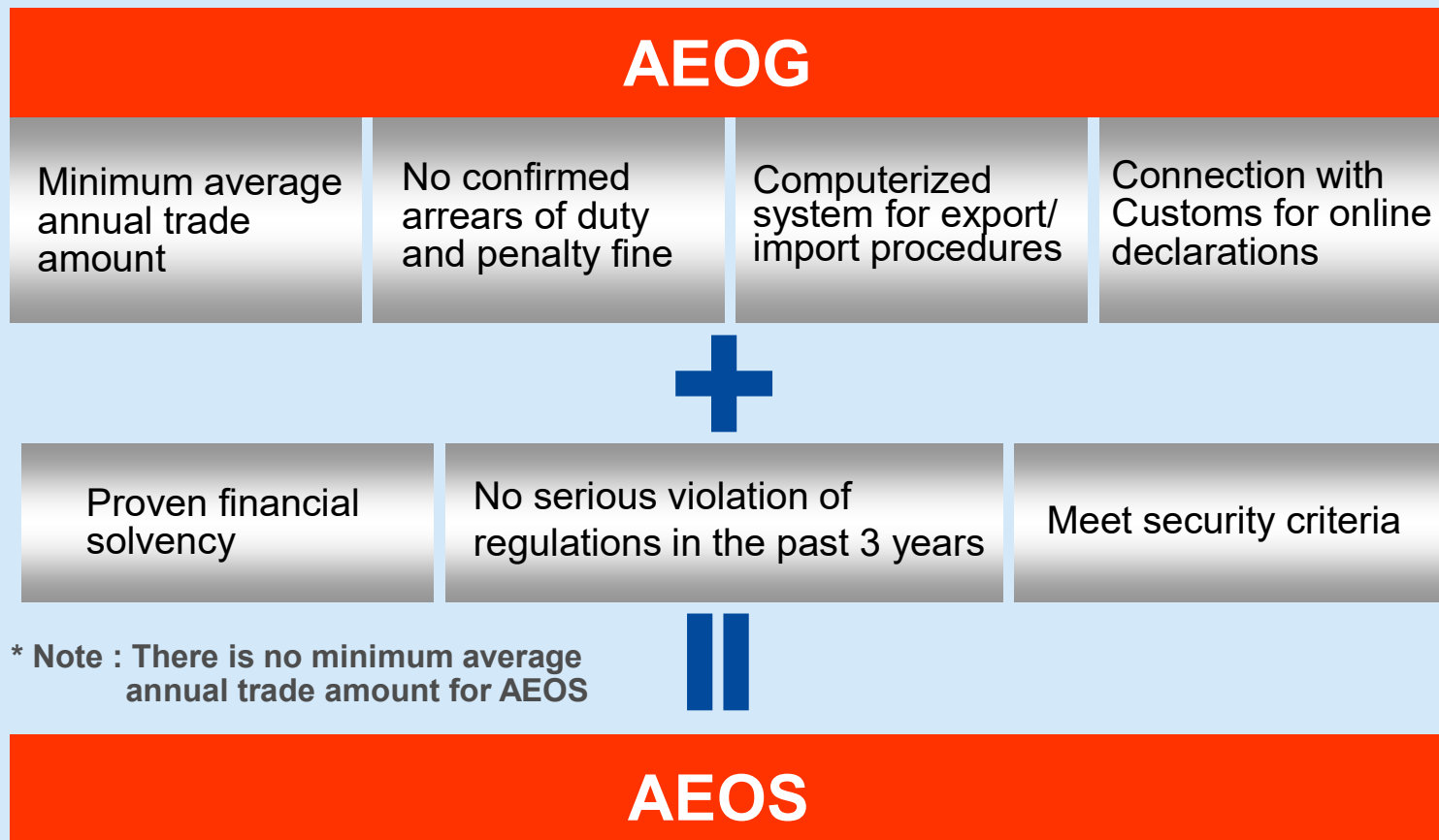

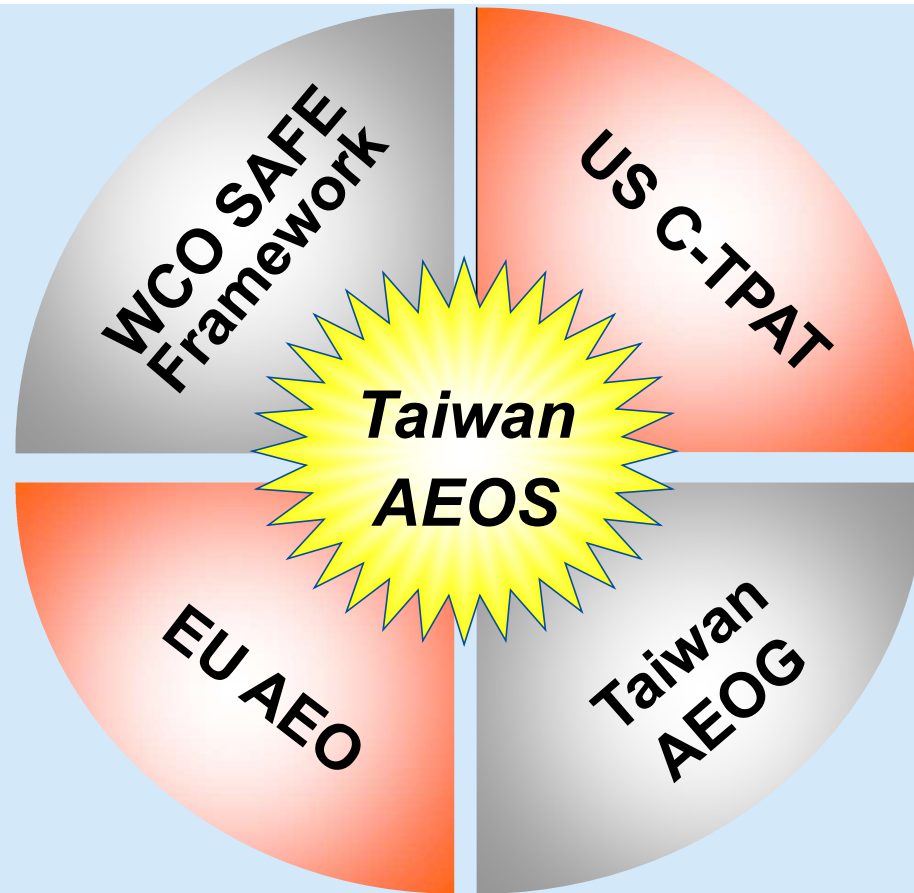

AEO Preferential Treatments for AEOG

✓ **The lower examination rate**

✓ **Monthly consolidated payment of duties**

✓ **Monthly payment of duties without deposits**

✓ **Re-imported MIT goods may be released with self-affidavit**

AEO Preferential Treatments for AEOS

Extra Preferential Treatments (Compared with AEOG)

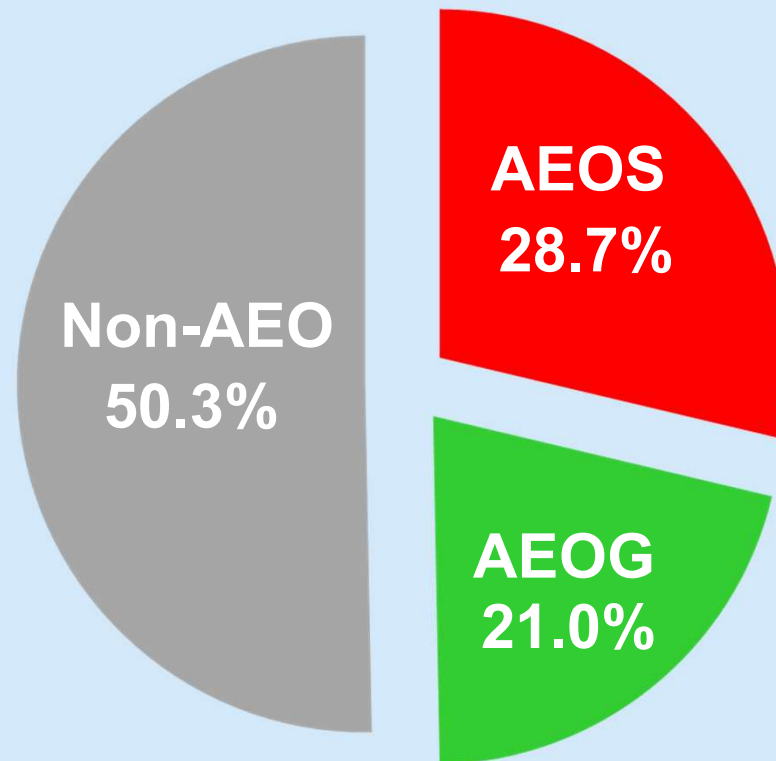
- ✓ The lowest documentation examination and goods inspection rate
- ✓ Given Priority for goods being inspected
- ✓ Customs contact window for handling un-released goods
- ✓ Non-intrusive inspection
- ✓ Goods cleared more than NTD 100 million may be via C1 mode

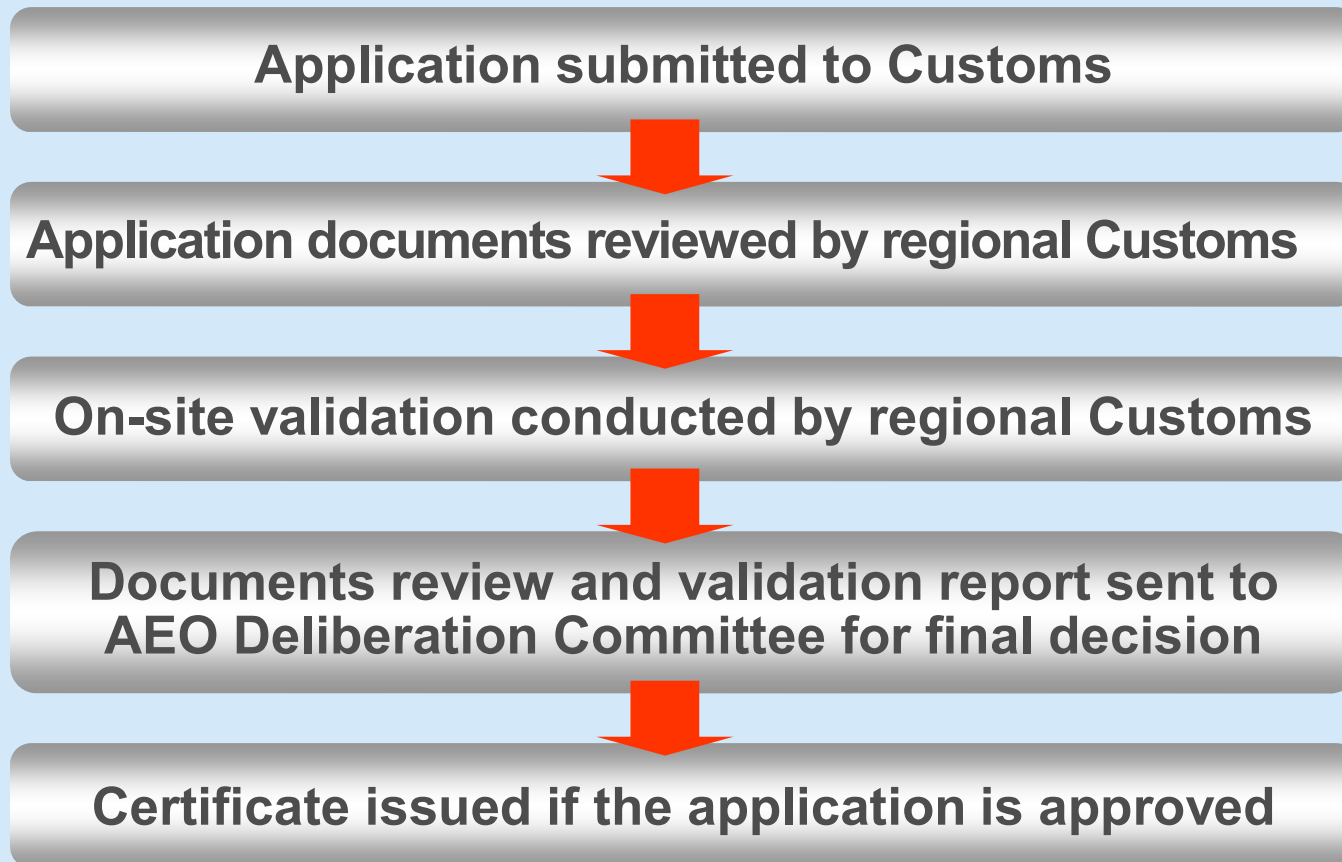

Certification Process of AEOs



AEOs shall submit its self-examination result every year to the competent Customs, and the Customs may conduct spot check at irregular intervals; otherwise, on-site revalidation will be required every 3 years.
