


- Globalisation has intensified cross-border movement of live animals and animal products, raising the risk of transboundary animal diseases (TADs).
- The Asia-Pacific region faces continuous exposure to these threats.
- We already experienced the incursion and spread of TADs in the region.



• There have been limited opportunities at the regional level for veterinary authorities to exchange information on veterinary inspections at the border or international trade.

 A proactive approach is necessary to understand national systems, identify gaps, and strengthen inter-agency collaboration within countries and cross-border cooperation among veterinary authorities.






- Assess the current status of international movement of animals and animal products and border control in the region, highlighting key challenges and good practices.
- Promote the use of WOAH International Standards, especially the Terrestrial Code, in national and regional strategies.
- Identify effective approaches, such as technological tools and stronger coordination, to improve border control and to address informal/unregulated/illegal movements.
- Strengthen regional information sharing.
- Identify and propose future issues that WOAH and its Members should address
