

- Pervasive challenge of insufficient communication and information exchange between trading partners, often stemming from unclear or absent contact points, the lack of publicly available import requirements, and difficulties in verifying the authenticity of health certificates.
- Both exporting and importing countries consistently highlight limited human and infrastructure capacity, specifically in areas like lab testing, the establishment of robust traceability systems, and the technical expertise required for timely import risk assessments.

How to address: strengthening bilateral coordination, adhering to and harmonising with WOAH standards, leveraging digital platforms such as WAHIS and promoting the widespread adoption of e-certification, and engaging diverse stakeholders including various government agencies and the private sector.
